The wh bark *Arnolda* and bark *Buena Vista* cleared from the Custom House yesterday.

The wh bark *Young Phoenix* arrived yesterday, 129 days from New Bedford.

The *Ceylon's* departure yesterday evening drew quite a large crowd at the esplanade, to bid farewell to friends. His Majesty the King was present to shake hands with the Japanese Envoy and Mr. and Mrs. Ratard. A salute of 17 guns was fired from the battery.

A Chinese prisoner escaped from the Station House last evening about half-past nine o'clock. He was in a cell and asked permission to go into the yard to obey a call of nature, and after the lapse of considerable time, failing to obey the call to go back and be locked up, it was discovered that he was gone, evidently "over fence out" as the boys say. A needle in a haystack is a faint comparison to a Chinaman amongst the horde on Hotel Street.

A report comes from Makua, about eight miles beyond Waianae, on this island, that two persons were severely injured at that place on Sunday last, by the accidental discharge of a gun. It appears that a native man, at the house of Mr. Samuel Andrews, who was absent in town at the time—was in the act of taking the gun down from the wall, when by some means it went off, and the ball passed through the hand of a child near by and struck the child's mother on the shoulder, inflicting in both cases, a severe but not necessarily dangerous wound. It is not stated what the man was doing with the gun, but it is quite evident that he was not keeping the third Commandment of the Decalogue.

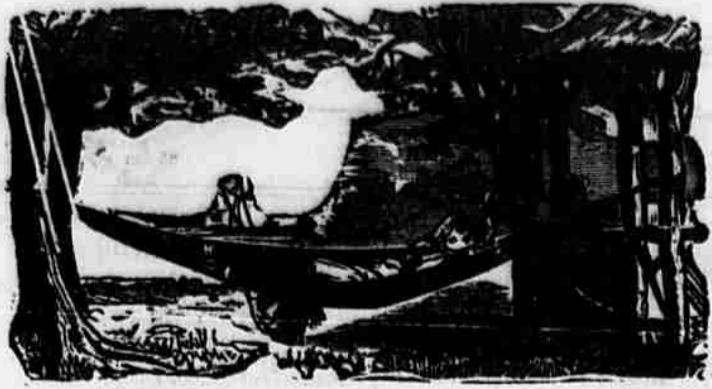

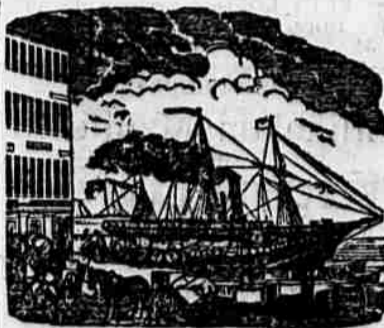
