SECTION 2. It shall be lawful for the Minister of Finance to continue to make payments in accordance with the appropriations authorized by this Act until the Thirty-first day of July, A. D. 1896, and thereafter at the same rate until new appropriations are made.

Secritox 3. The Minister of Finance shall not cause or allow to be paid from the Treasury any money for the objects named in this Act, except as herein provided, and the unauthorized expenditure of any money from the Treasury, to be thereafter accounted for to the Councils by Indemnity bill, is hereby expressly prohibited.

SECTION 4. No person holding more than one office, for which salaries are provided, shall be authorized to draw more than the salary of the highest grade of office held by him, if the salary of any office held by him shall amount to Eighteen Hundred Dollars or more per annum, and shall be entitled to no other or further compensation.

SECTION 5. The Minister of Finance shall not pay or allow to be paid from the Treasury any sum on account of any item of this Act in excess of the due proportion of the amount appropriated for such item for the time elapsed; provided, however, that the Executive Council may authorize the Minister of Finance to pay, on the requisition of the head of any department, moneys in excess of such proportion. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect and become law from the date of its publication. Approved this 26th day of April A. D.






