DENTAL PLUGOER. **GENERAL DEBILITY** Leading Technical Paper on a Hono and Indigestion ulu Man's Invention The Scientific American of May mtains a cut of and an article de cribing the new dental plugger in-vented by Mr. Ormond E. Wall of Honolulu. The tool is described having a double action, being able to strike a number of blows with the point at a single revolution of the shaft. Besides fillings of any shape may be perfectly placed and located in any desired position. In operation, the plugger is screwed to the "chuck" the teeth of which

are, by pressing on the point, brought in contact with the ratchet teeth on the outer face of a rotating piston. the four teeth causing four blows to be struck at each revolution of the daft. For the rear action, the point, when the teeth of its inner ratchet

engage with the inner ratchet of the otating shaft, produce a similar series of blows. By pressing on the button to prevent the revolution of the cylinder, the operator is enabled to pick up gold, carry it to the cavity and place it in the desired position the plugger remaining at a standstill and without stopping the machine. 


