DEATH OF MALIBRAN.

DRAMATIC ACCOUNT OF THE GREAT SINGER'S FATAL SWOON.

Response to the Demands of an Impatient Audience—Disastrous Results of a Physician's Mistake—Terrible Minutes of Fear and Suspense—Too Late.

M. Legouve, in his volume of "Souvenirs of Sixty Years," just published, gives, among many charming reminiscences of Malibran, a dramatic account of her death, the recital of which will not be out of point here.

The manager of the concerts was about going upon the stage to face the impatient audience, when Malibran opened her peerless eyes, arose, checked the manager and—staggering forward until she was in view—seemed then all at once seized by an inspiration, and sang her encore more divinely than she had ever been heard to sing before.

At the same moment, and without having any suspicion that his wife was in danger, Beriot, who came next on the programme, stepped upon the stage from the opposite wing with his beloved violin, and began one of the astonishing airs with variations for which he was famous.

"It must not be done!" he cried to the doctor. "She must be bled," persisted the physician, "or she may die of suffocation in an instant!"

Beriot and Lablache flew together to the greenroom. It was too late. From the naked arm of Malibran the blood was flowing. The physician, despite the warning of those who knew Malibran's temperament better than he did, had insisted upon opening a vein; and thirty-six hours afterward Malibran was dead.

**THE NEW CONSTITUTION.**

In a supplement to this issue our readers are given the full text of the Constitution born of the recent uprising of a large body of influential classes of the community, to demand the redress of grievances and the inauguration of good government in place of a long regime of misadministration. Until the instrument has been before the people a little while, and pending some experience of its operation under the administration of a Cabinet identified with its birth, it is well, perhaps, not to review it too closely. As striking the happy medium between the views of a conservative element, who would have been satisfied with the promise rather than push the performance of constitutional reform, and the views of a radical element, who would have unconditionally and unreservedly followed up the advantage gained by the tremendous demonstration of a people's righteous indignation last week, to the point of the sweeping away every vestige of a system under which enormous abuses had grown up to overshadow the land; looked at, we say, as a compromise between the differing sections just mentioned, there can be only one opinion uttered, and that is that the revision of the Constitution has been very successfully executed. There are still portions of machinery remaining which had been under the late era of misgovernment put to outrageous uses, but the new chart of fundamental law must be examined as a whole and then it will, we hope, be found to contain effective checks upon the mischievous capabilities of the mechanism referred to under other conditions. Perhaps, however, it would have been better if there had been a more radical reorganization of the system, one combining both increased simplicity and diminished irresponsibility in the direction of affairs. As a matter of public rights, for instance, the prolongation of the existence of the King's Privy Council of State, as an active appendage to the Executive, may be regarded as something to be seriously questioned. Still there may be reasons of expediency to be urged for an extended lease of life to that body. While it contains members whom a free and enlightened electorate would never choose as representative men on their merits, yet it comprises others having large experience both of the country and its public affairs, who may be exceedingly useful counsellors but be impossible to bring out as candidates to serve the country in either legislative branch. The abolition of the House of Nobles as a body of legislators appointed for life, whether they performed their functions faithfully or habitually neglected them, should meet with general approbation. That branch of the Legislature had sadly run to seed. Its members who could be relied upon, when their help in the nation's extremity was most required, could be counted twice on one hand. As hinted above, we should prefer to let patience get in some of her perfect work for the present, while the operations of the new system under a new directorate are observed for a while. At the same time it must be conceded on all hands, that the revised Constitution on the face of it marks a prodigious forward stride in Hawaiian liberty. Reforms, hoisted and spurned over and over again out of a corrupt and servile Legislature, are obtained at one stroke when demanded by a long sleeping as well as long-suffering, but now aroused and no longer passive community of freemen.

**BOARD APPOINTMENTS.**

By official announcements in this paper it will be seen that there has been a reconstruction, under the new order of things, of the Boards of Education and Health, and the Bureau of Immigration. The Board of Education is entirely new, but its President, Hon. C. R. Bishop, formerly enjoyed the confidence and esteem of the country in the same position, and that important body is now constituted of men from whom a wise and progressive educational policy may be anticipated.

Three new members are appointed to the Board of Health, with a physician of high standing at the head, the first time in a long period that medical science has been recognized as desirable in the body having charge of the public health. The other members of the Board, remaining from the old one, are Hons. A. S. Cleghorn and C. P. Laukaa.  
Four new members succeed to the Bureau of Immigration, the Minister of the Interior being *ex officio* President making five. Practical knowledge of the needs of the country respecting immigration, together with preponderating business ability, gives this body a very substantial appearance as now constituted.
