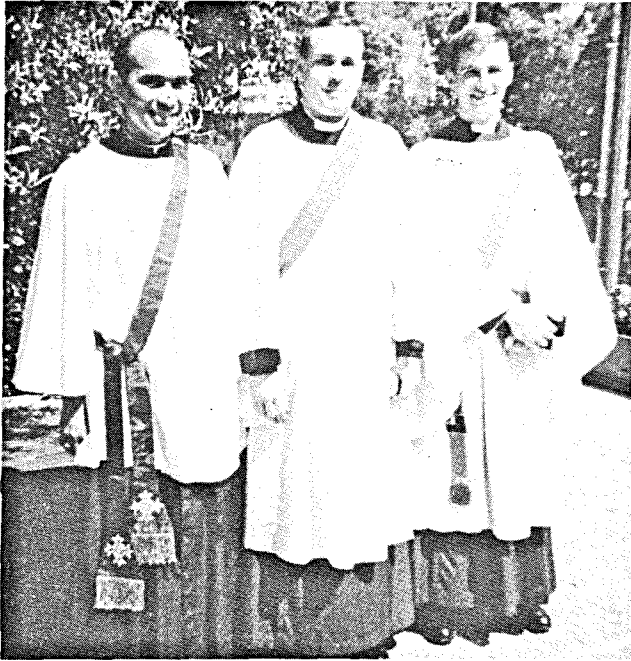

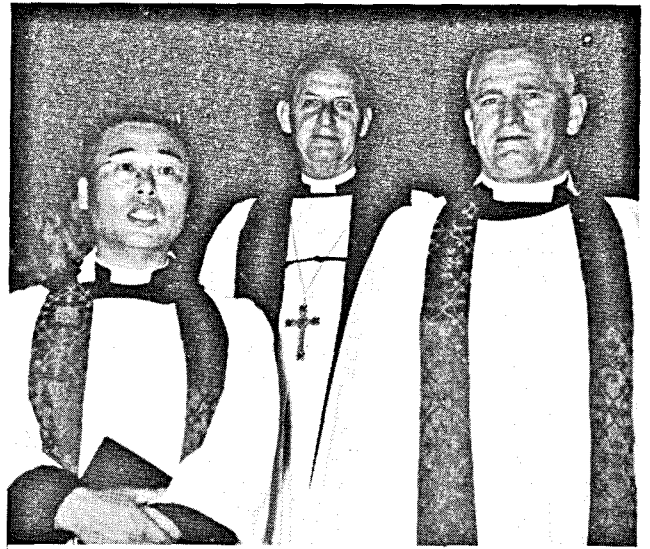

Survey to Be Made

Ordained to The Priesthood

The Reverend Albert J. Collins, Vicar of St. Augustine's Church, Kohala, and St. Paul's Church, Makapala, Hawaii, and the Reverend John H. Chung, Vicar of St. Columba's Church, Paauilo and St. James' Church, Papaaloo, Hawaii, were ordained to the Priesthood on Friday, June 7th, at 7:30 P.M., in Holy Apostles Church, Hilo, Hawaii, by the Bishop. The Reverend E. Lani Hanchett, Rector of St. Peter's Church, Honolulu, presented the Rev. Mr. Collins and the Rev. Paul H. Kim, Vicar of St. Luke's Church, Honolulu, the Rev. Mr. Chung. The Venerable Gerald P. Loweth, Vicar of Holy Apostles Church, preached the sermon. The Rev. Norman R. Alter, of Christ Church, Kealahou, read the Litany for Ordination; Mr. Daniel Thompson, Warden of St. Columba's Church, read the Epistle, and The Rev. Thomas K. Kunichika, the Gospel.

A reception for the Ordinands was given by Archdeacon and Mrs. Loweth in their home following the service.

Ordains Sons

July 7th, at 11 A.M., in St. Andrew's Cathedral, the Bishop ordained his sons, David Kittle Kennedy and Paul Sherbourne Kennedy to the Diaconate. The Reverend Bruce H. Kennedy, Rector of the Church of the Holy Family, Monterrey, Mexico, preached the Ordination Sermon. The Reverend Fred Minuth, Associate Rector of Holy Nativity Church, presented David and the Reverend Thomas K. Yoshida, Associate Rector of All Saints Church, Kapaa, Kauai, presented Paul. The Preface to the Ordinal was read by the Reverend Paul M. Wheeler, Rector of St. Clement's Church, Honolulu. The Dean of the Cathedral, the Very Reverend John J. Morrett, read the Litany. The Rev. Canon Wai On Shim, Retired Rector of St. Elizabeth's Church, read the Epistle. The Reverend David Kennedy read the Gospel. Twin brothers of the Ordinands, Joel and Mark, also participated in the service — Joel was his father's Chaplain and Mark played the organ. Assisting clergy were: The Rev. William R. Grosh and The Rev. E. Lani Hanchett.

Following the service an informal luncheon was given by Bishop and Mrs. Kennedy in Davies Hall, honoring the Ordinands.

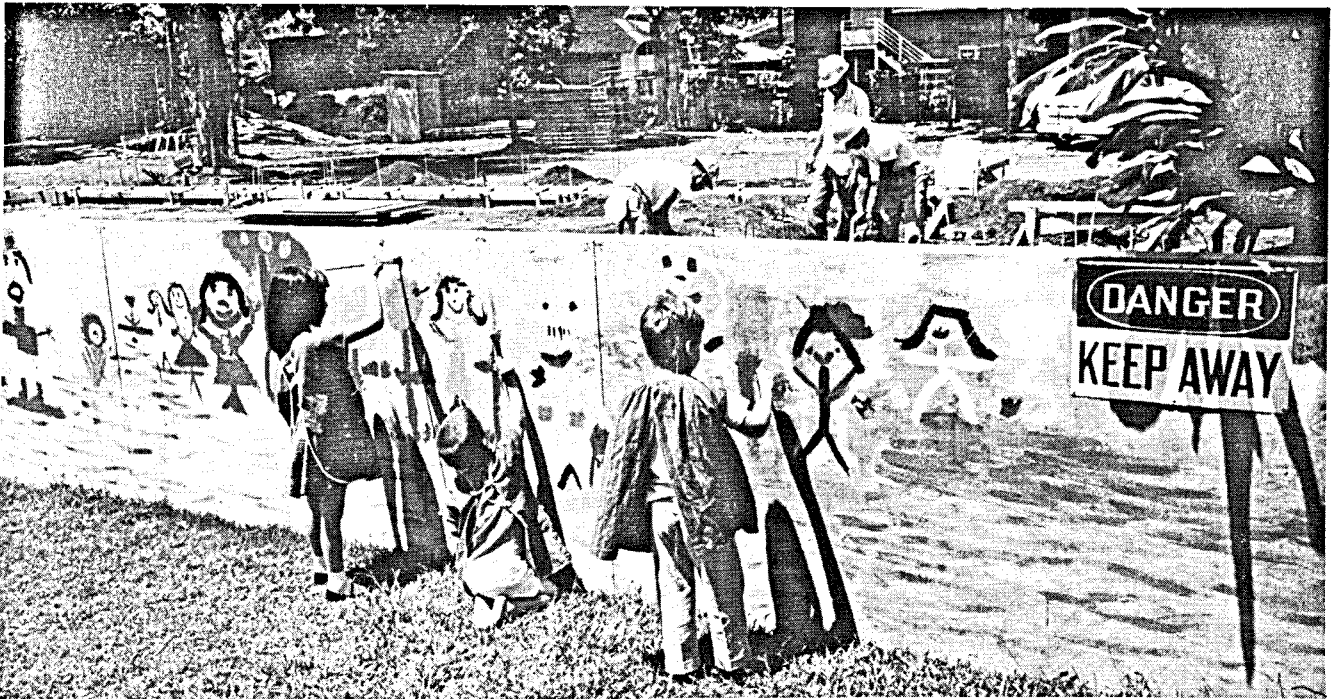
Both young men were members of St. Andrew's Cathedral, graduates of Iolani School, Honolulu, Trinity College, Hartford, Connecticut, and The Church Divinity School of the Pacific, Berkeley, California, where they graduated on May 30, 1963. They were also jet pilots in the United States Air Force, David serving six years as a jet fighter pilot and Paul serving four years as a jet bomber pilot.

David Kennedy has been assigned as Vicar of St. Barnabas Church, Ewa Beach, Oahu. Paul has been assigned to the Missionary Diocese of Central America, with headquarters in San Jose, Costa Rica.

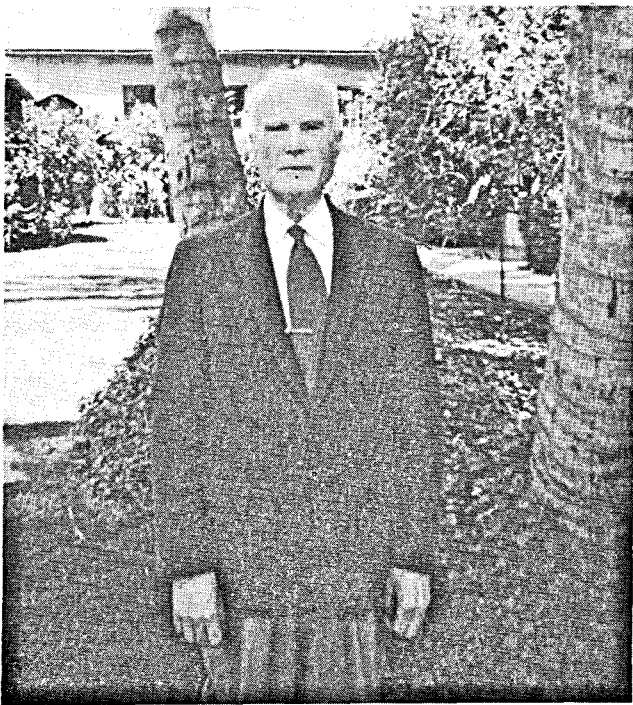
The Reverend David Kennedy has a wife, Anna Marie, and three small sons, Christopher, Paul and Karl.

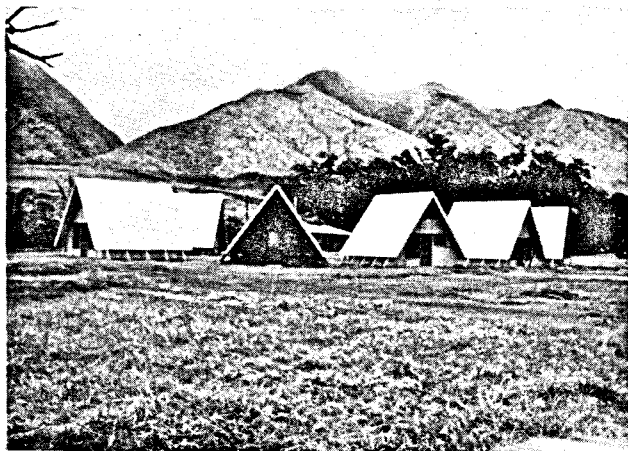
He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Harvard, his Master's degree from the University of California, and has done Pre-Ph.D. study at Stanford University.

Mr. John McCreary, the new organist and choir director of St. Andrew's Cathedral arrived on July 24th. He will also direct the music at St. Andrew's Priory School for girls when school opens in September.

He comes to the Cathedral with high recommendations, one of which is from Dr. Paul Callaway, of Washington Cathedral, Washington, D.C.

He received his Bachelor of Music from the University of Michigan in 1954. He spent the summer of that year in Europe playing and carefully inspecting organs in Holland, France, and Germany. He returned to Michigan to get his Master's degree in 1956. Following this he went to Europe to study improvisation with Jean Langlais, the organist at Sainte Clotilde in Paris. He has played two recitals in Washington Cathedral, and has been organist of All Souls Church, Washington, D.C., where he has been for seven years.

Extra-ecclesiastical work has included teaching at St. Alban's School and the Potomac School, singing in Washington Opera Society, playing many organ recitals, and musical director and conductor of the American Light Opera Company, in Washington.

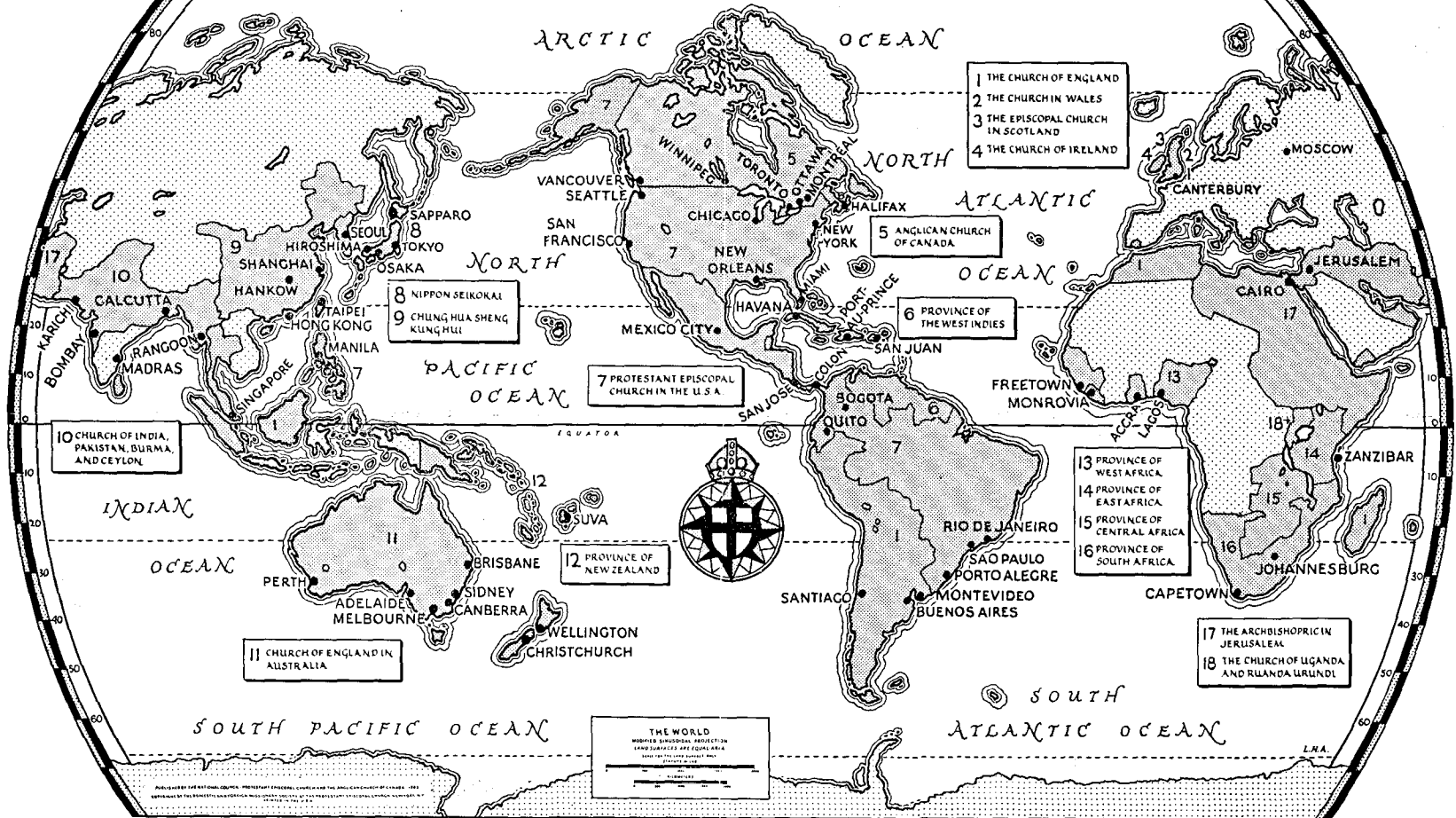
Supplies at Epiphany Church

THE WORLDWIDE ANGLICAN COMMUNION



The Anglican Congress of 1963, to be held in Toronto from August 12-23, will be an abundant evidence of the missionary outreach of the Anglican Communion during the past one hundred years. The Anglican Church, established in nearly every part of the world, has a membership of forty millions. From the 344 dioceses which comprise 30 ecclesiastical provinces of the world-wide Anglican Communion, there will be approximately 1,000 official delegates and 500 unofficial delegates. From Hawaii will be the Bishop, the Rev. Joseph Pummil, Rector of St. Mark's Church, Honolulu, and Mr. Henry F. Budd, Diocesan Treasurer.
