## GREAT GOLD FIND.

Six Discouraged Miners Stumble on a Fortune.

Another El Dorado—Marvelous Discovery of Precious Ore in Australia—Fabulous Wealth Revealed—People Thronging the Site.

ADELAIDE, Sept. 1.—Reports have reached here from Coolgardie to the effect that a fabulously rich gold reef has been discovered at the Londonderry mine, which is situated eleven miles south of Coolgardie. The reef is three feet wide and juts three feet out of the ground. The lode is marvelously rich, one-tenth of the ore being gold. Work has been carried on in the lead for six weeks, and the tailings now weigh one and one-half tons. A man who arrived by coach from Coolgardie last night says he offered the owners of the claim £1000 per day for a monopoly of the claim, but his proposition was rejected.

Intelligence from the mine is to the effect that 4000 ounces of gold have been doliied out in three weeks, while specimens measuring a foot square are so heavy that one man cannot lift them. One splendid block, nine cubic inches in size, is so rich that Mr. Elliott, one of the miners, paid his mates £200 for their share in it. The doliied gold and several specimens are deposited at the Union bank. The claim is situated three miles from "Burbank's Birthday Gift."

The reef was discovered by a party of six tired and disheartened diggers who were returning from Lake Lefroy. They were prospecting along the route when they struck the outcrop, which showed pieces of gold weighing a pennyweight each. In the beginning of May leases were taken up in twenty-four acre lots. Later an application was lodged for exemption for all save the central block because of the difficulty in obtaining water. The application was never made to the warden's court, but no work was done on the blocks, which have been consequently jumped. All the work has been done on the central block.

THE LESSEES OF THE TREASURE. The holders of the leases are Messrs. Elliott, a farmer of Avoca, Victoria, Mills, Huxley, Gardner, Carter, and Dawson, all of whom have received offers of immense sums for the property. J. E. Scantlebury of Sydney offered £25,000 cash and Capt. Begehoite and others have made similar offers, all being refused.

The gold in sight is estimated to be worth much more than the sums mentioned, despite the little work done. The country is held for long distances at each end of the prospectors' claim. The reef is described as of ironstone and the gold is carried in clear quartz, slightly amber-tinted, and a coarse wire of gold stands out of the stone. Experts consider that fully one-third of the visible ore is gold.

Three of the original holders of the Londonderry property sold their sixth interests for £3000 each soon after gold was first struck. Gold is rapidly accumulating at the Coolgardie banks. The owners of the Londonderry claim admit having banked over 5000 ounces, with 20,000 more in sight.

Prospector Mills made the discovery which has created so much excitement. He was a mile and a half from camp, when he came across one of the many large blows which are characteristic of the country. He was astonished on rubbing his hand across a protruding piece of stone to see gold standing out prominently. He knocked a large piece off the boulder and at his feet lay a magnificent specimen literally studded with coarse gold, while before him was a splendid reef of almost pure gold. Mills lost no time in taking several pieces from the reef and carefully covered it with earth. He found his mates and communicated to them the startling intelligence. The camp was hastily struck and removed to the locality of the discovery. Next morning a lease of twenty-five acres was pegged off and adjoining blocks at each end were also taken up during that week. In the meantime they set to work to further examine the reef, and stored the precious metal in their tent. They also commenced to systematically develop the property. One of the partners went into town and bought a dolly—the largest he could procure.

THE BONANZA BECOMES APPARENT. Then it was that the richness of the mine became apparent. In one day, working on some marvelously rich stone, the prospectors doliied 1000 ounces, and in a short time they had about 4000 ounces in the tent. June 3 the partners decided to place this large quantity of gold in safer quarters. They packed it into several saws, and a cart in charge of two of the party safely landed the

The object of the Salvation Army throughout the world is to "reach the unreached" and they've succeeded in thousands of instances.

We do not believe the reformations have always been permanent any more than the efforts of Francis Murphy or the ministrations of Dr. Keelley have proved entirely satisfactory in the matter of intemperance.

They, like Mr. Moody, work upon the sympathies of the people, they get them first interested and then enthusiastic, when slap, bang, comes a desire to do better.

But because there have been backsliders among the Salvationists or among the people who have once yielded to the persuasive eloquence of the late John B. Gough or a Murphy there is no reason why these reformers should not be encouraged.

If a man or woman has gone to the dogs and a curbstone preacher is successful in lifting them up, even temporarily, it is infinitely better than if they had continued on a downward course.

Temperance lecturers and Dr. Keelley have been scoffed at because their cures have not been permanent. Suppose they have not! Take, for instance, a man who draws his wages Saturday night and spends it in rum before Monday morning, leaving his wife and children without the necessities of life; "a bad state of affairs you will say."

Well, suppose by some means or other he has a year of sobriety, is it not a blessing for his family to have just that one year? Intemperance and crime are close friends and scientific men consider them as diseases, oftentimes hereditary, which like consumption may be cured or relieved according to circumstances.

The Salvationists reach both by getting a hold on one, for it seldom happens that a man who thinks he is religious is a drunkard. We are not giving a lecture on religion nor are we exhorting people to give up their "stout and bitter," nor do we propose to don a red coat and shout hal-le-lujah from one end of town to the other, we merely wish to call your attention to the fact that up to the hour of going to press there has never been a windmill introduced that would compare in any respect with a galvanized steel Aermotor.

There are instances right here in Honolulu where wooden mills have been taken down and a steel Aermotor substituted. This has not been done except through a preference for good things, and because people wanted more water than any wooden mill would pump.

A little 12 foot wheel out at the Ostrich Farm forces water 65 feet high through six hundred feet of pipe. It will do more than that but it happens that nothing more is required. A gentleman called on us the other day and wanted a mill and pump that would raise the water fifty feet and force it through thirty-two hundred feet of pipe.

We guarantee to do it and never turn a hair. We have never heard of a wooden mill of the same size that would do it, some day there may be one made but we doubt it because the tastes of the people run toward lighter material. The Aermotor has been tried here and is no longer an experiment. When a customer calls upon us to purchase one we first ascertain the work to be done; if it is within the power of a windmill to do it we say so and then guarantee it; we have never had to take a mill back.

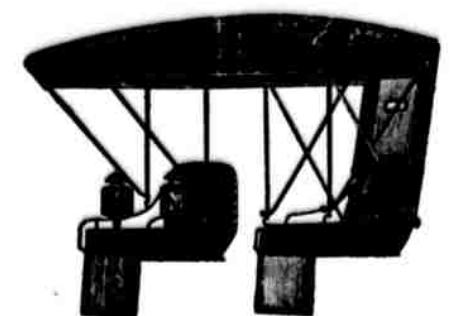

The Japanese residents celebrated the victory of their countrymen with a grand luncheon in a residence on Nuuanu street, owned by San Yu Shoshu. The festivities began at 7 o'clock and lasted until 3 o'clock this morning. During the evening three female Japanese singers arrived and gave an impromptu entertainment. Mine host Krouse of the Arlington had a job put up on him lately. A weight Government official held a live egg to the bulb of a thermometer in the office. Then a few fellows in the secret began howling about the heat. Wilder leaves San Francisco for Honolulu to-morrow.

BREAKING-UP OF THE WRECK.

The Wreckers Secure Loads of Flotsam from the Cargo. The steamer J. A. Cummins was telephoned as ten miles off at 9:10 o'clock this morning. As she had been to Kalaokailo Point, the wreck of the wreck of the Geo. N. Wilson, members of the syndicate who purchased her were on the qui vive of excitement, expecting favorable news, owing to the detention of the steamer over Tuesday night.

What made them all the happier was the intelligence conveyed through telephone by Charlie Peterson, the Diamond Head lookout, that there were several cases of goods on the deck of the J. A. Cummins. The steamer arrived in port between 10 and 11 o'clock and all cases were in sight. J. Bowler and J. Lucas, with Fred Whitney as passenger, pulled out to the steamer and boarded her. She soon after tied up at the Oceanic wharf. There was quite a crowd present, all eager to hear the latest from the wreck. The hearts of the syndicate men were made glad by the report that there were nearly two hundred cases of goods, including liquors and groceries, in the fore-hatch of the steamer. When the J. A. Cummins arrived at Kalaokailo on Tuesday, she found the schooner Haleakala and her men engaged in picking up cases floating around. It was impossible to go near the wreck. The mainmast had gone by the board and caused the ship to break in two. The goods had begun to come out of the vessel on Sunday morning, but not a great quantity came away the first two days. On Tuesday the packages began to come out in great numbers, and the ten men on the Haleakala had all they could do to pick up cases floating about.

Natives had come from other parts in two whaleboats, and they filled up the boats with cases of liquors. E. B. Thomas, who is with the wrecking party, remonstrated but without avail. When the whaleboats were filled the natives retired to land and had a good time. After taking all the cargo saved from the Haleakala, the J. A. Cummins left at 6 o'clock this morning for Honolulu. Jim Barrington and another man came up by the steamer. Barrington says that nothing can be done unless a southerly wind sets in. All that the men at the wreck are now doing is lying down and watching for floating cases.

The syndicate will hold a meeting this afternoon and decide what to do further. There were landed from the J. A. Cummins this afternoon about 170 cases, including 17 cases of Elephant gin and 9 cases of Irish whiskey. There are several cases of J. T. Morton's preserves, mustard, pepper and other articles, besides cans of cocoa, dry goods and toys. Purser White of the steamer W. G. Hall reports that the Molokai channel is full of wreckage. Off Diamond Head the steamer passed a case of Irish whiskey.

Forty-five Cents. A Japanese woman caused the arrest of Sam Lun, a Chinaman, this morning for the embezzlement of forty-five cents. According to the woman's story, she had sent Sun to a Chinese store to buy five cents worth of mountain apples, giving him at the same time fifty cents. The apples were bought but Sun refused to hand over the forty-five cents change. So she had him arrested for embezzlement. Sun's story is a direct contradiction. He says the woman gave him only five cents, and it was a case of blackmail. Both maintain their assertions, so the case will have to come up before Court. In the meantime Judge Perry will read up Solomon's wisdom.

Season Tickets. Manager Dailey has decided to give his steady patrons the benefit of a substantial reduction for the forthcoming season, and is issuing season tickets good for eighteen performances at \$15. The season will commence with Monday evening's production of the celebrated comedy "The Player." The Catholic ladies of this city have persuaded Mr. Dailey to give away Tuesday evening next to them and the company will appear on Monday instead. Every worthy object of this kind has Mr. Dailey and his company's sympathy, and this favor will doubtless be properly appreciated by those having the fair in charge.

Changes at the Station. Several changes are contemplated in the Police Station. It is intended to close the door of the receiving station, facing Merchant street, and remove the clerk's desk to the rear of it. A door will be opened on the Ewa side, where the window now is, and entrance will be made through the stable gate. This improvement will afford more space for officers and prisoners. It is also contemplated to erect a house on the vacant lot, mauka of the Station, for the "mountain climbers." At present they are located in the stables, and the proposed new structure would be a boon to the men.

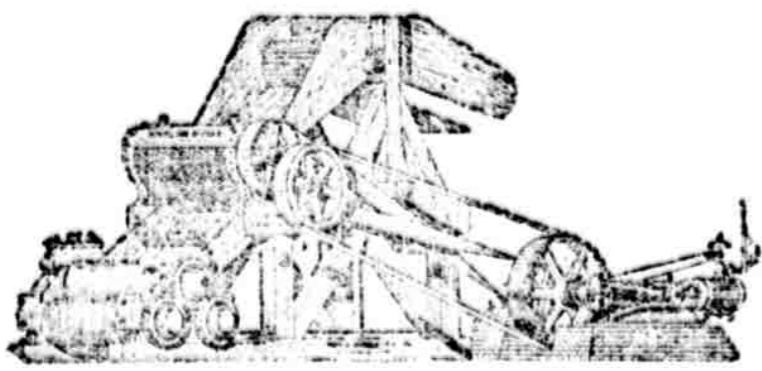

treasure at the Union bank. The manager weighed the stone in the presence of the owners. It tipped the beam at 4270 ounces. It was a few days after this that the discovery became known to the public. A number of gentlemen interested in mining visited the locality. They were at first refused permission to see the mine, but the partners, after consultation, decided to lay bare their treasure. The exhibition was marvelous and opinion was expressed by the visitors that they were standing face to face with the richest mine yet found in Australia. The gold runs through the stone in coarse lumps and those who have minutely inspected the specimens express the opinion that about one-fourth of the ore is solid gold. There is a history attached to the biggest of these specimens, which is known as Big Ben. It was among the first pieces that came away from the reef and it is remarkable for the fact that it contains more gold than ore. It weighs about 240 pounds and is worth £3500. Messrs. Huxley and Mills have secured Dawson's share and Carter's has been bought by Mr. Elliott, who now holds a third of the mine.

Gen. Pless, who has just returned from Colorado, gives a splendid account of the field. He has secured several valuable leases at Hannau's rush, and he thinks highly of the cement formation of the country. Specimens of ore have been exhibited and show coarse gold right through. On account of their cement nature the hills can easily be worked on the open face system. Mr. Pless believes enormous quantities of gold lie in these hills.—Chicago Times.

### A Wonderful Artificial Hand.

Willard A. Lucas, the son of a great woolen manufacturer at Poquetanuck, Conn., wears an artificial hand made of aluminium which is really one of the automatic wonders of the century. Young Lucas lost his hand in his father's mills, and Lucas, Sr., who grieved exceedingly over the results of the accident, wrote or went in person to every known manufacturer of artificial limbs in this country and Europe, vainly seeking for a false hand for his son. Artificial hands could have been procured from any of them, but what was wanted was not to be found, viz., a hand that could perform all the functions of a real flesh and blood member. Finally the older Lucas, who is known as a rare mechanical genius, took it upon himself to make his son a hand—a most wonderful piece of mechanism reads as follows: "With it he can grasp and handle use all kinds of tools, pick up things from the ground, drive, handle a gun—in fact, use it quickly and skillfully at any kind of work. Like a natural hand, the artificial one consists of a palm that is provided with a fastening by which it is attached to a cork 'stump,' the joints working by a ratchet, so that the fingers may be bent forward at any angle and held there. The hand may be only partly closed or tightly shut, and only one finger or all, as the wearer desires, may be closed at once and instantly by striking them against the body or other object. To release the grasp it is only necessary to touch a spring at the back of the hand. The invention is as nearly a perfect substitute for a natural hand as could be devised, and is the only thing of the kind known in the world.—Chicago Times.
