OPINION OF THE COUNTRY

We have received several communications from subscribers and correspondents on the other islands relative to the suspension of Portuguese immigration and find that the opinions expressed therein are all of the same tenor and all strongly disapproving of the unauthorised step taken by the Premier.

FINANCE.

The statement of receipts and expenditure for the quarter ending 30th September is now before us. A comparison of this statement with that for the previous quarter shows a decrease in receipts of no less than \$69,401.26.

Since the above article was written we have been informed by the Auditor General that NONE OF THE MONEY, received from the Chinese who arrived here in April last, HAS BEEN PAID INTO THE TREASURY and that he has never received any accounts of the receipts or disbursements in connection with their arrival, landing or quarantine expenses.

Stmr Mokohi brought 342 bags of rice, 5 hogs, and 15 sks of potatoes. The Isle of Anglesea sailed yesterday for Portland Or., in ballast and stores.

The most sacred day of the Jewish year will be from Wednesday to Thursday next, the day of Atonement.

At the Police Court yesterday three cases of drunkenness were dealt with and Maki was fined \$5 for disturbing the quiet of the night.

PROSPECTS of a band concert in Emma Square on Saturday afternoon and another at the Hawaiian Hotel on Monday evening. Good Governor.

A gentleman suggests that the new library building should be two stories high. He is willing to contribute \$100 towards carrying out his suggestion.

THE Advertiser office is gradually but surely falling over. Two inches a week is the average. It is even betting whether this building or Robertson's tower goes first.

It is now certain that the wreck found on Mount Ararat is the remains of Noah's ark. They know it by the grease mark in the bunk where Ham was stored.—Yonkers Gazette.

His Majesty goes to Waimanalo to-day and will proceed on Saturday to Laie to attend the Mormon festival, returning to Honolulu on Sunday. It is not yet decided whether the Premier also goes to the Mormon festival, of which mention is made below.

At 6 o'clock yesterday morning a butcher's horse bolted, down Fort from Hotel Street, with a wagon attached. At the corner of King St. the wagon capsized and the horse was killed.

A "gentle Hawaiian" was riding yesterday a young horse which he had pulled so hard that the animal's mouth was bleeding. The horse, objecting to this treatment, stopped and was kindly kicked by another "gentle Hawaiian."

Dry weather is the subject of a few remarks made by our daily contemporary yesterday. Dan Lyons objects to them and says it isn't dry on Merchant St. as Cunha's is close by.

ON Wednesday the information was given that the Board of Health were to be praised for the small number of deaths in September. Our little thanks were duly rendered on our knees in our sanctum, but a clause was inserted in them which reserved a small portion of thanks for Divine Providence.

BRIBERY of a Police officer has been again attempted. The Chinese opium dealer, who was fined \$100 and sentenced to six months imprisonment, offered Captain Mehrtens \$20 to let him go. Mehrtens took the money which he handed to the Court, and the Chinaman takes his trial on a charge of bribery.


