OPINION OF THE COUNTRY

We have received several communications from subscribers and correspondents on the other islands relative to the suspension of Portuguese immigration and find that the opinions expressed therein are all of the same tenor and all strongly disapproving of the unauthorised step taken by the Premier. The planters say that they require more laborers, and, as we stated a few days ago, some seven hundred Portuguese have been applied for in excess of those that are coming; the contracts of the first imported laborers of this class will, moreover shortly expire, and they ask how are their places to be filled. We learn from the Hilo and Hamakua districts that the Gibson Ministry has never obtained or held any very high opinion there, but now, what few friends the Premier could once rely upon, have deserted him. One correspondent writes, " all are now opposed to Gibson, especially on account of his" late act in regard to the Portuguese.

FINANCE.

The statement of receipts and expenditure for the quarter ending 30th September is now before us. A comparison of this statement with that for the previous quarter shows a decrease in receipts of no less than \$69,401.26. In this decrease, which is a large one for so small a country, is most noticeable a falling off in the customs receipts of \$35,000 while the expenditure in the departments of Attorney-General and Public Instruction show an increase of about \$10,000 for the quarter. We feel at a loss how to account for the decrease in customs since we have been recently and so frequently informed by the Government organ that business has been flourishing and that the trade of Hawaii has never been so good, and we shall be anxious to see how this decrease will be accounted for. We feel afraid that our expectations of a balance of \$150,000 in the Treasury at the end of the year will not be realized. We should like to be informed into what fund the sum of \$17,438.25, received from the Chinese who were landed here in April last, was paid, through whose hands it passed and an account of the expenses connected with their landing and quarantine.

Since the above article was written we have been informed by the Auditor General that NONE OF THE MONEY, received from the Chinese who arrived here in April last, HAS BEEN PAID INTO THE TREASURY and that he has never received any accounts of the receipts or disbursements in connection with their arrival, landing or quarantine expenses. Verily the office of Auditor General is a needless one in Hawaii.

This however was not necessary as the force, having made a careful and diligent search through every straw, found a garter snake three feet long. The snake is now dead. Be careful when feeding horses.




