

TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

The Japanese naval budget provides for the building of twenty five war vessels.

Recent rains in California have done serious damage to the fruit and hay crops.

Mexican bandits captured over \$100,000 in silver bullion, from a mule pack train.

The Yaqui Indian raiders are keeping the Mexicans busy in the Sonora mountains.

A rich strike is reported on Chicken creek below Dawson, in American territory.

American capitalists have purchased the Ogilvie Milling Co. of Canada, for \$11,000,000.

The Boer war cost the British over a billion dollars and 100,000 men, killed and wounded.

'Skeets' Martin, an American jockey, rode Ard Patrick to victory in the English Derby.

Up to date, 119 bodies have been recovered from the Crows' Nest passenger mine, at Fernie, B. C.

By the terms of the peace treaty, President Krueger will be allowed to return to the Transvaal.

There is no change in the condition of the Pennsylvania coal strike, and water is rising in the mines.

The radicals have gained control in the new French Chamber of Deputies by a vote of 303 to 267.

Governor Sayers of Texas has been seriously ill for two weeks, and his friends are becoming uneasy.

The Charleston Fair closed May 31, and the enterprise proved a loss financially, but was a success otherwise.

It is estimated that \$40,000,000 would not cover the loss of property resulting from the destruction of St. Pierre.

As a reward for his services in South Africa, Lord Kitchener will be given the title of Viscount and £50,000.

The copper wire trust is about to dissolve, which would cause a reduction of 20 per cent in the price of copper.

The Cunard and other steamship lines are negotiating plans with the British Government to fight the Morgan combine.

Queen Wilhelmina of Holland has so far recovered from her late alarming illness as to have taken her first outing May 31.

The recent earthquake in Guatemala destroyed a prison containing one hundred and forty men, every one of whom was killed.

An American scientist states that the result of the eruption will probably be that the whole Island of St. Vincent may be submerged.

German manufacturers are cleverly imitating objects of American manufacture, notably in the line of shoes, hardware and furniture.

The first test polo match for the American cup was played at Hurlingham, England, May 31, and won by the Americans, by two goals to one.

A new Boxer insurrection has broken out in Southwest China, and many missionaries, converts and Chinese tax collectors have been murdered.

While government troops were marching into the town of Bocas, Colombia to recapture it, mines of dynamite were exploded, killing nearly all of them.

The director of Egyptian excavations for the University of California has just enriched the museum of that institution with some rare antiquities discovered at Garga, on the Nile.

Two jewel experts who have examined the regalia to be used at the coronation of England's sovereign have made the discovery that nearly one-half of the "gems" in the regalia are spurious.

SHIPPING NEWS

The Claudine has been on the ways for quite a while. She will most likely resume her regular route next week.

The Henry Villard is discharging coal at a rapid rate in Kahului, preparatory to loading a full cargo of sugar for San Francisco.

The Ship Emily Reed, of which Geo. A. Baker is master, leaves today in tow of the Maui. She is bound for the Sound where she will probably load coal.

The Bark Antiope, Capt. Murray, arrived at San Francisco on May 31st, just fifteen days from Kahului. This is a good record and reflects well on her young Captain.

Arrangements are being negotiated whereby the Claudine is to extend her run to Hilo after the races there on the Fourth, and bring the Hilo and Honolulu contingent of racing stock directly to Kahului, from Hilo.

The gasoline schooner "Eclipse," under charter to the American Shipping Co., has been sold for debts contracted by her owners, the Hawaiian Navigation Co. Von Hamm & Young were the purchasers, and they will spend several thousand dollars more in fitting her up for their inter-island trade.

The "Albatross" returned to Honolulu on Wednesday, after a week's successful fishing cruise off the coast of Kauai, during which many "queer fish" were netted, some from a depth of 730 fathoms. Two of the boats of the abandoned ship "Fannie Kerr" were seen at Waimea, but nothing had been heard from the burning derelict.

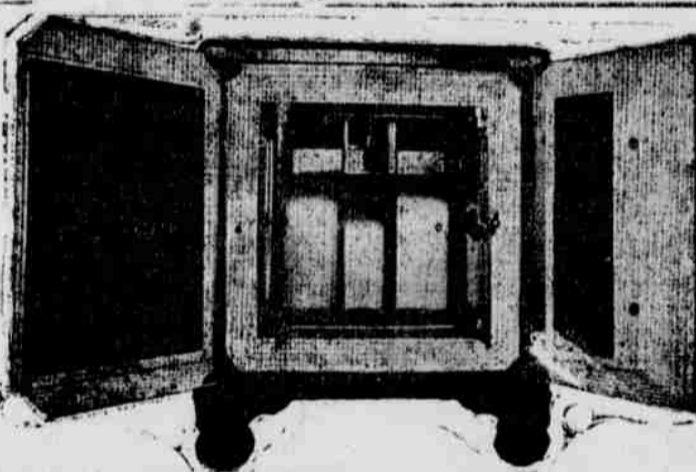
