Is all the excitement in the air from the new era?

There is enough time yet for the Legislature to put a general statement on file.

Make Arthur Day a school holiday. There are enough National holidays already. It is a grand, pleasing and profitable institution in the United States under patronage of the public schools.

Why doesn't the Advertiser name names or furnish thumb marks or give a skeleton for identification of the Government Physicians whom it claims are incapable and neglectful? Are any of the board of health scientists or specialists or politicians or rate makers in this district meant?

The Star has been firm, consistent and continuous in opposition to encroachment on the Sabbath of rest and worship. For the present comment on the marked innovation of Sunday ball games, we reserve. There will be the issue clearer if there is to be one.

It is required that the Legislature shall finish its labors and adjourn sine die at the expiration of the extra ten days allotted by the President and Cabinet. It would be a neat bit of work and a pretty record entry if the lawmakers failed to use all of the added time. It would be worth the while doing this to earn the reputation of such an unprecedented performance.

Some of the country's biggest and best men are now on the high seas or ashore in foreign lands. The Attorney General, who is one of Hawaii's strongest individuals, is in the Orient on an important mission. P. C. Jones and Minister Damon are en route to San Francisco on business and pleasure. They are two of the Island big four in finance. J. B. Atherton and Wm. G. Irwin are the other pair. Senator McAndrew is also visiting his spouse. Mr. R. F. Dillingham is only planning at present and then, H. Davies is absent from the land. Rev. R. H. Baldwin and others are moving even. That there are in Hawaii a good many other men of excellent ability in money matters and general management is shown by the active personnel in the conduct of affairs.

NATURALIZATION.

There should be some agitation, thought and study on the subject of naturalization. It is to be regretted that the matter was not brought into prominence before Mr. Hatch went to Washington or at least in time for the Legislature to fix a procedure, as contemplated by the constitution. Naturalization is entirely within the jurisdiction, management and judgment of the justices of the Supreme Court, the detail or process to be indicated by law. There is no law yet in the premises, though the Chief Justice has been using forms that will, so far as they extend, duplicate the process of naturalization. The need, however, for an act, is of course obvious. But Hawaii has no naturalization treaty with Great Britain, the United States or any other country. Subjects of these lands have been made full-fledged citizens of the Republic with the last year's act, and the citizens of Greece. Now an American who becomes naturalized here cuts away from his former allegiance and attaches himself to Hawaii. The agreement is between the man and this Government, without the consent or knowledge of the government of his native land. Can allegiance thus be transferred? If the British Crown or the United States were rounding up citizens, could not either say to the former subject here: "Come along. We never sanctioned in any way your relinquishment of our protection, your departure from our shores. We have no cognizance of your arrangement with Hawaii. There is nothing in the treaty which would permit or authorize it. There is no warrant for you to claim Hawaii or Hawaii claim you." This seems logical and it seems good law. The fact that at least one administration in the United States has rather had the policy of repudiating its citizens who made Hawaiian citizens of themselves in another matter, as well as the principle that a foreigner here who involves himself in local politics forfeits the protection or aid of his native land, is a matter separate from naturalization. There is growing among a large body of the foreigners permanently settled here a sentiment of nationalism. Those who have identified themselves with the Hawaiian Government, most or the Republic feel that they are in a doubtful or questionable position as to citizenship. A great many have come to think enough of Hawaii to become fully and regularly her subjects and to "abjure allegiance to all other powers, princes, potentates and nations especially to the United States." Such a form would be a clincher and the Star believes, with many residents that it would be a dead letter after annexation, but "political union with the United States" may be delayed for some time. They are pretty busy with their own affairs over here just now and have plenty of work ahead of them, with a good, strong feeling of national pride and interest would be a much better country in every way and if the way to such a possibility is facilitated there will be men and numbers to take hold with willing hands.

OWNERS OF A GENIE.

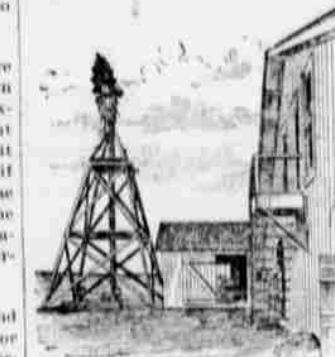

GEARED AERMOTORS

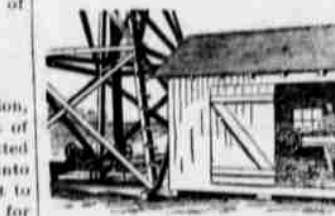
THEIR SIMPLICITY OF CONSTRUCTION AND EASE IN FACING THE WIND.

In the pasture and grazing districts of these Islands it is not always convenient to have power separate from that used to obtain the water for stock and we wish to state that the Geared Aermotor not only produces a sufficient flow of water for house and stock purposes, but by a belt connection does away with the extra power required.



GEARED AERMOTOR.

The above cut represents the 12 foot Aermotor pumping water and cutting feed at Kapaa, Kauai, and the lower cut brings the manner of connection in closer perspective, showing the cane tops in the process of being turned to food.



CUTTING CANE TOPS.

The feed grinder is always in position. You have only to turn a hand screw to adjust the lower grinding ring sufficiently close and it is all ready for use or in an instant you can put on a belt to run any other machine. The saving of power effected by having all bearings rigidly connected in one casting and therefore in proper place, is no less important than the matter of convenience allowed too.

The coming week we will erect a steel tower Aermotor at the Queen's Hospital. We are to take the one now in use as "slops" as it has not been satisfactory at any time. We guarantee that the Aermotor will pump sufficient water for all uses and furthermore that the Aermotor will run in half the wind required by other mills, and regulates in a strong wind as well as in a mild wind. It handles the pump the smoothest of any mill made. An eight inch stroke Aermotor will throw more water with less wind than any of the old style mills. The Aermotor presents one-half the surface to the wind; it is apparent that this other wheel must have five times the tail surface to make it face the wind equally well, thereby greatly increasing the liability to wreck in a storm. The mere fact that we have placed 150 more Aermotors on the Islands is sufficient guarantee of their superiority and desirability by those who want a motor that looks after itself.
