The Mexican Government has concluded a centract with Mr. Occar A. Broege to plant two millions of trees in the valley of Mexico within four years, commencing March 15, 1889. Half a million trees a year are to be planted in such places as the Government shall decide. The contractor pledges himself to 80,000 acculyptus trees, 60,000 tronos-japenes, 60,000 mountain cypress cedars, 60,000 acculas, and 120,000 of miscellanceus varieties. The trees must be in plantations of from 50,000 to 100,000 each, and Mr. Broege has to maintain them for two years sater planting. He is not compelled to plant trees along the highways, however. Three graduates of the School of Agriculture are to be received into the numerics each year, there to study the science of forestry. He is also to raise fruit and other useful plants for free distribution. There is to be translated from the German every year a work on arbornal-inter of recognised merit. An inspector is to superintend, and Mr. Droege is to receive annually 40,000 dollars till the sum reaches a total of 200,000 dollars.

S. gold. No question was raised in Court as to the requirement of the legal tender Act, which makes the U. 
