### "PARALLEL LINES"

"These are solemn times" for the "old party" who has been "running things to suit" himself in Hawaii. He has "waxed fat and kicked." "W. M. Gibson has disgraced the Kingdom." "We pity the old party." "The people of this country have found him out."

The "old party will remain out in the cold." "The Hawaii which" he and his "ilk controlled so long" will soon be "a thing of the past." "Minister Gibson's strength lies with the workmen." How did he appreciate the manner in which the Workmen spoke of him at the last meeting of their Union? "The people have had enough for the present of the old party." It has been so far, a funny failure that "parallel lines" business, and we are anxious to see our contemporary complete the parallel in the sweet *mahope*.

### SANTA CLAUS

Has taken up his head quarters on Fort street, at the well known store of Mr. T. G. Thrum. One is naturally attracted by the display in the windows of everything suitable for a holiday season, not only for little children, but also for grown children. At a first glance we thought that the proprietor had a Government contract and sole monopoly for supplying the King's Own and Berger's Band, for Importing Chinese and the Kapiolani Park Tramway. We saw military arms and equipments, guns, cannons, musical instruments and plenty of those big drums for which Berger is famous. There are horses for juvenile mounted police; steamers for carrying immigrants and which can beat the Mariposa's best time, and tramways that must have been ordered by Mr. Flowerdew, as they are so good. Targets, with negro heads, for our little armed contingent to aim at (not to hit), trumpets and tambourines. Father Christmas sits in a corner calmly and placidly surveying the scene, which will bring happiness to the homes of many.

For the big children there are many beautiful things, such as toilet sets in plush and fancy cases, handsomely bound and illustrated books, out of door games, tennis and croquet, an elegant line of work bags, reticules, work baskets, odor cases, portmanteaus, purses, card cases, pocket wallets, cigar and cigarette cases, handkerchief and glove boxes. Among the larger illustrated books we found Longfellow's Evangeline, the Heart of the White Mountains, the Salmagundi Birth-

day Book, the Raven illustrated by Dore, Pastoral Days, Highways and Byways, the Cambridge Book of Poetry and Song, the Princess by Tennyson, Colton's General Atlas, and many others, all equally instructive and interesting. The line of silk fringed Cards, for all occasions, is indescribable and inexhaustible. For the children there are dolls of all sizes, ages and prices, Noah's animals that walked in "two by two," hoops, carts, wagons, foot-balls, wheelbarrows, paints, blocks, puzzles, and a superior assortment of books. Having in view the advantages of a technical education, and desiring to co-operate with the President of the Board of Education, sets of carpenters tools have been provided for boys; mothers can have hen-coops, and sisters their dolls' houses and furniture, made by their loving sons or brothers. There can be no excuse for not writing to distant friends at Christmas time as inkstands, ink and novel writing papers can be obtained. Articles ornamental are in profusion, bisque ware, photographs and engravings of those beautiful studies of nature, for which Thrum's store was so famous last year; the swiss carvings too are very handsome. But why attempt to enumerate, when no description can afford any idea of what there is at Santa Claus' headquarters. Go And See.

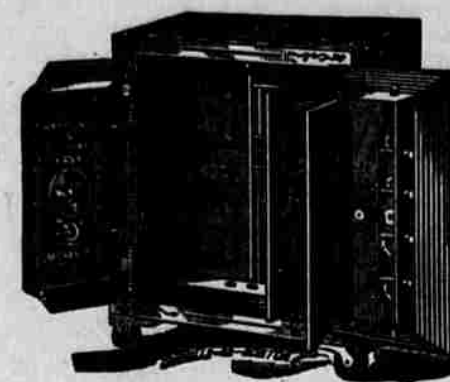

THE first "Hawaiian Hoodlum," as  
designated by the counsel for the defence  
in Saturday's case celebre, made his  
appearance as a witness for the Attorney-General  
ad interim.

At the next regatta, His Majesty's  
yacht, Healanii, will have a new adversary  
to compete with, as Mr. J. T. Waterhouse,  
Jr., and Mr. W. Dimond are expecting a  
clipper from England.

SOME curious revelations were made  
on Saturday of the inward workings of  
the police machinery. Governors,  
marshals and deputy-marshals appeared  
to be somewhat mixed. The machinery  
wants cleaning, as it is somewhat clogged.

Mr. J. M. Davidson made his first  
appearance in court, since his return to  
Honolulu, on Saturday. He expressed  
his ideas of the courtesy due from one  
member of the bar to another, and  
objected to some remarks made by a  
brother professional.

THE "Hawaiian Hoodlum" said in  
evidence on Saturday that one of the  
defendants (who was sitting on his horse  
at the time) held him round the body,  
while another one hit him, and he fell  
backwards. The holder, however, did  
not fall, so the inference is that, as he  
was so slim, the "Hawaiian Hoodlum"  
fell through him. The "H. H.'s" story  
is however, too slim.

"BARTONE" kindly informs us that  
there is to be a grand concert at the  
Music Hall about Christmas time, in aid  
of the funds of Punahou College.  
"Bartone" says he will not miss the  
opportunity of hearing another "blow"  
from the man who has played before  
most of the "Courts of Europe," and  
that he will engage a front seat.

THERE was a complication of offices  
on Saturday at the Police Court. In the  
absence, upon this occasion, of the Attorney-General  
ad interim, Mr. W. Austin  
Whiting was Acting Attorney-General  
ad interim, and, during his absence  
from the court, he deputized Captain  
Mehrtens as acting for the Acting Attorney-General  
ad interim. The Deputy Attorney-General  
ad interim was also present.

THE Attorney General ad interim,  
having taken a personal part in the late  
celebrated Police Court case, purely  
the idea of upholding the law, will doubtless  
at once take action against the policeman  
who committed perjury. He might also  
"suggest" to Captain Tell that special  
attention be given to the nature of an oath,  
when the force attends divine service every Sunday.

AN impromptu oyster feed was arranged  
on Thursday afternoon by a gentleman  
who had not seen a fresh oyster for four years.  
A bottle of stout was procured, a temporary  
table erected in the corner of a store and  
the bivalves speedily disappeared. The "By Jove,"  
uttered by the oyster-famed man, after  
he had eaten his first, came from the depths  
of his heart, or stomach. He was left opening  
a second dozen much to the amusement  
of Messrs. Kennedy & Co., who were the kind hosts.

In the suit of R. A. Macfie, jr., vs. The  
Kilaua Sugar Co. and W. T. Horner, a  
decision was rendered on Saturday by  
the Chief Justice in favor of the plaintiff.  
This is an important test case regarding  
the position of a surety, and has been  
watched with some interest by our mercantile  
classes. The bill brought in Equity, was  
sustained by the Court, with one or two slight  
amendments to be added, and the demurrer  
of defendants, to the bill, was overruled.

THE Police Court case, in which the  
Attorney-General ad interim took such a  
lively and personal interest, was heard  
on Saturday. There was no case whatever  
against Captain Hayley and Mr. Hay Wodehouse,  
and, after hearing the evidence, the crown entered  
a *not. pros.* against these gentlemen. Mr. Jas. I. Dowsett  
Jr. was discharged, the Court saying that  
the policeman must have made a mistake or  
exaggerated his story. He dwelt strongly upon  
the necessity of officers wearing their badges  
in conspicuous places, and telling people who  
they were and what they were about to do.  
In the present case the Court did not think  
that a jury would find Mr. Dowsett guilty of  
the charge laid against him, from the evidence  
that had been submitted. Mr. W. Austin  
Whiting for the Crown, Mr. J. M. Davidson  
for the defence.
