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On the occasion of the visit of the King to the Emperor of Japan, at Tokio, a number of prisoners were pardoned and liberated, as a mark of special grace, inspired by the presence of His Hawaiian Majesty.

We published a full half sheet extra of the P. C. Advertiser on Wednesday the 20th inst., giving full particulars of His Majesty's reception in these islands. In the latter part of that year, Commissioners from Japan arrived, who represented to our Government that some of these people had been induced to leave home through misrepresentations; and forty were selected to return to Japan. But it was with difficulty that these people could be induced to leave. Four of the number; two men with their wives had been engaged on Lanai. And they very reluctantly obeyed the order to return. THE ORDER OF CHRYSANTHEMUM.—The Japanese spelt the word Kisanthomum, a flower of much beauty and interest; and the insignia it represents, presented to His Majesty the King, as decoration made of fine gold. The centre of the corolla is a ruby; and the petals are all pure gold, and outside of the corolla are a circle of sunbeams, all of pure gold. The chief intrinsic cost of the decoration however is in its case, which is solid gold. The whole cost being about one thousand pounds sterling.

HIS MAJESTY, who has some taste in military affairs, and has read very extensively leading military authorities, was very highly gratified by his visits to the Imperial Guards' College, the College of Engineers at Tokio, and on the occasion of his presence at reviews of Japanese troops. The high efficiency of officers, both technical and practical, and the admirable drill of troops, called forth the highest encomiums from His Majesty.

A case of interest to sporting men in this community, and also to those who have considerations objections to horse racing and similar amusements, was heard on Wednesday before Mr. Justice McCully and a jury. Mr. Macfarlane and Mr. H. F. Agnew each put \$500 into the hands of Mr. A. McWayne as stakes on a trotting race which came off some months ago at Kapiolani Park. Mr. Agnew believing that the decision of the Judges in the matter was not in accordance with the acknowledged rules of racing, protested against their decision which made him the loser of the stakes. The protest was not sustained by the Judges but Mr. Agnew was not convinced. Finally he sued the stakeholder for a return of his money, on the ground that betting on horse races is an illegal transaction, and that he is therefore entitled to reclaim his money if circumstances lead him to feel that it is no longer a "debt of honor." Mr. Preston on behalf of the plaintiff sought to bring horse racing within the meaning of the words



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
