





Vaccination.

It is greatly doubted whether vaccination is a protection against small-pox. The statistics of the London Metropolitau hospitals go far to shew that it is not. Out of 15,171 small-pox cases, from 1876 to 1880, no less than 11,412 were of persons who had been vaccinated. But even this is not conclusive against the efficacy of vaccination. It is well-known that the human system undergoes a thorough change every few years. Not a particle that existed in the boby seven years ago forms a component part of it now. With such a change it is absurd to expect that a single vaccination in early infancy can be perpetually effectual throughout life. The propriety of repeating it at various periods of life is thus evident.

Though it may be well doubted whether vaccination be an entire preventive against small-pox, we think it is clearly established that it greatly modifies its effects. Those who have been vaccinated are not so much affected by small-pox as those who have not. They are more likely to recover, and are not so greatly marked in person by the disease. This result alone is sufficient to commend vaccination to the prudent. Then the opinion of the most eminent physicians is unanimous in its favor. There is no danger in getting vaccinated, and there is more inconvenience than pain, or trouble, connected with it. That, however, is inconsiderable, and should never prevent any one from getting it done. The more one is affected by the vaccination the more he stood in need of it being done, and the worse he would have been with small-pox had he taken the disease without being vaccinated. We would certainly say to all-Get vaccinated. If it does no good, it will do no ill, and carries with it besides a great relief to the mind, which of itself is a considerable protection against the disease. -Scottish American Journal, January 26.
