The barkentine Jane A. Falkenberg and schooner Anna, sail for San Francisco at noon to-day.

The mail by the J. A. Falkenberg, for San Francisco, will close at the Post Office at 10:30 a. m.

The steamer City of New York arrived yesterday morning from San Francisco, and sailed at 5 p. m. for Sydney. She left San Francisco at 2 p. m. on Sunday March 12th.

The Band gave a concert of seven selections at the rotunda of the Hotel last evening, and the night being fine, the verandahs were full of listeners, and the streets of carriages and pedestrians. This was Concert No. 213.

There was a landslide on the mountain back of Waimalu, one day last week, said to have been an interesting sight to look at—from a distance—huge rocks and masses of earth carried everything before them with a noise resembling thunder.

A memorial service, in honor of the memory of the late President James A. Garfield, was held by Congress in the Capitol at Washington, on the 28th February. The Diplomatic Corps attended in full regalia, and were headed by the Hawaiian Minister as Dean of the Corps. A paper containing an account of the service may be seen at our store.

A sad accident happened at Kailua, on Sunday last. An interesting half-caste child, a girl about 7 years old, had been bathing in company with grown persons in the stream. Being missed, search was made by diving, and the body found in a deep eddy, but life was extinct. She had arrived that morning from Maui, where her father—Mr. de la Cruz—resides, on a visit to some relatives.

There was a real burglary and an attempt at safe smashing, on Sunday evening at Mr. Wm. Johnson's store on Fort street, near the corner of Merchant, which is jointly occupied by Mr. Clark, watchmaker. The thief or thieves entered through the back window and by breaking a bolt on the door, got access to the front room wherein was the safe, the object of the visit. This was considerably nicked, and on top was a pair of tailor's shears with the points broken. A pocket-knife (which the owner can probably have by calling for it, etc.) was found on the floor, and also scattered matches. Mr. Johnson lost a suit of clothes from his tailors department, but Mr. Clark misses nothing. The work was evidently not that of an adept or professional burglar, but looks like an attempt of a bungler.

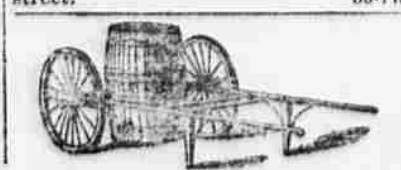

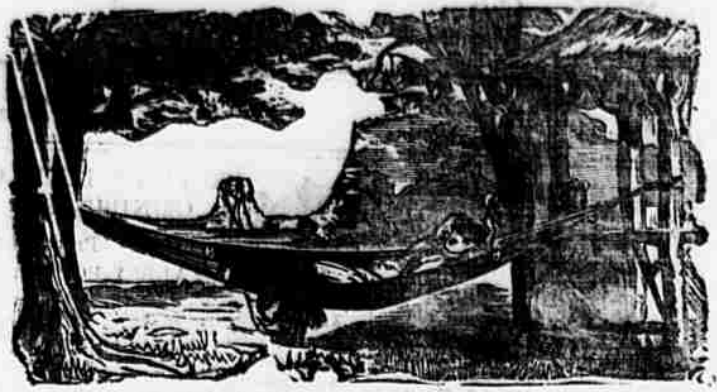

Attempted Assassination
OF
QUEEN VICTORIA.

Another attempt to assassinate Her Majesty the Queen was made on the evening of the 2nd inst, while she was entering her carriage at Windsor Railroad Station. She had arrived at Windsor from London, and was walking across the platform of the railway station to the carriage, which was waiting to take her to the Castle, when a man standing at the entrance of the station yard, among the spectators, pointed his pistol at the carriage and fired. No one was hurt. It caused great excitement. The man was immediately seized, and taken to the Windsor Police Station.

The miscreant gives his name as Roderick MacLean, and is a dis- charged lunatic. Two letters were found on his person. In the first, which was written before the shoot- ing, he said he was compelled to commit a crime against the "bloated aristocracy," because of insufficiency of relief offered him. In the second, written after his arrest, he said his only object was to cause public alarm, and get his pecuniary griev- ances redressed.

Congratulations upon the escape of Her Majesty have been forwarded from the United States and other nations.

This is the seventh time the life of the Queen has been attempted by assassins.

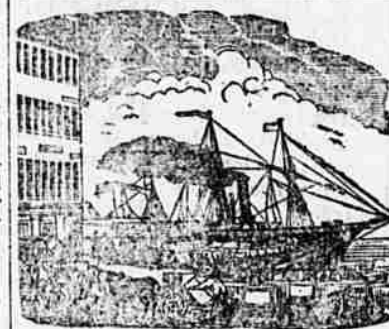
