A VITAL QUESTION

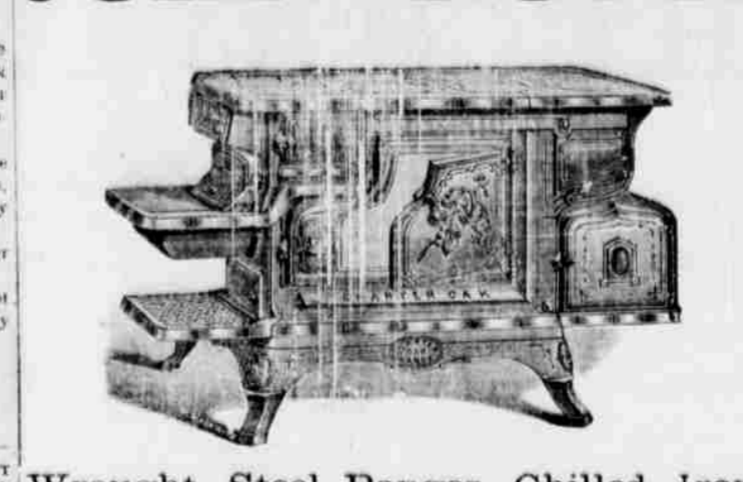
