Part of the \$2,000,000 loan has been placed in San Francisco. It is assumed that \$1,000,000 is taken there of which \$400,000 is to be in United States gold. All of the money borrowed in the United States should be in United States gold, there is no occasion to take cheap silver coin. The bonds can be paid (except for the proportion fixed by statute) in any coin but United States gold.

An Act of the year 1872 authorized the Minister of Finance to issue Government Bonds to the extent of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, bearing interest not exceeding nine per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, such bonds to be payable at such time as should be specified upon their face, but not later than twenty years from the day of their date.

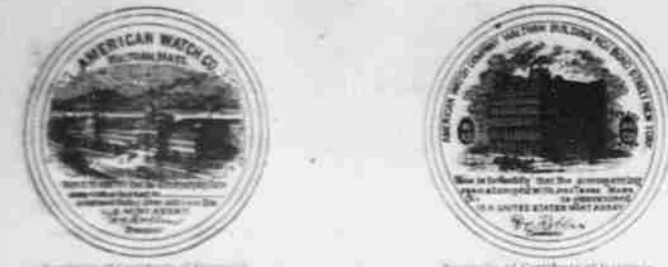

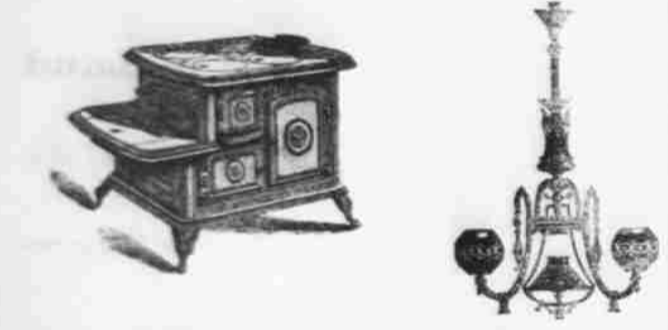
