 OPA audits 'ignored'

SEVERAL government agencies audited by the Office of the Public Auditor have ignored the watchdog agency's recommendations to correct irregularities in their systems.
According to an OPA report released yesterday, at least 126 of the 191 recommendations it had made between July and December 1997 remain unacted upon.
Public Auditor Leo LaMotte noted that cases of delinquencies

Most recommendations not adhered to, resolved, says report
had increased since June 1997 when OPA released its last annual report in which it noted 35 recommendations that were ignored.
The increase in cases of delinquencies has prompted LaMotte to seek the assistance of the Interagency Audit Coordinating Advisory Group in enforcing compliance from the "auditees.
LaMotte, in an annual report submitted to the audit advisory
group, noted that there are still outstanding recommendations since 1994 and 1995.

Because of this, LaMotte reit erated an earlier proposal for the Governor to designate an official from his office to enforce OPA's audit recommendations.
The public auditor initially made this proposal in 1996 when OPA first noted delinquencies among government agencies.

"It is not a time to again zap the citizenry with higher taxes especially the senior citizens and the disabled," Gutierrez said.
Joey Duenas, the Director of Revenue and Taxation was also present when the Governor ve-
toed the bill. He shared Gutierrez's view that a tax raise is just not acceptable.
"It represents a $100 \%$ increase on the tax rate on land," Duenas pointed out.

Expressing disappointment with the Legislature for moving the bill, Gutierrez said: "This bill kind of shook me up."

Korean Airlines flight 801 crashed about three miles short of the Guam International Air Terminal on August 6, 1997. Some 228 of the 254 passengers and crew aboard perished in the accident.
