Alfred Laureta was supposed to go back to Washington as my administrative assistant but has now decided to serve with Governor Burns' state administration.

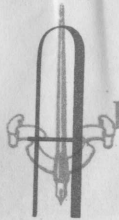


Me and mine wish you every happiness and measure of good fortune in the years to come. And I hope to be a visitor in Washington from time to time during Session as an observer.




I feel that I can call you Dan, Since we were in Hawaii before your election to Congressman and often I spoke with you around the social activities connected with the 442 Inf get-togethers.
