His Majesty will leave for a visit to Maui only this afternoon on the Kilauea Hou, returning to Honolulu March 26th. His visit to Molokai will be made from Honolulu direct, in a week or two after his return from Maui.

### Latest Foreign News.

Four hundred persons have been killed by the bursting of a dam in Algiers. Ireland still continues in a very disturbed condition. Roads have been blocked and bridges destroyed.

Fifty women have left New York to assist the promoters of the Irish-woman's Land League.
