The *Escort* sailed from New Castle, N.S.W., on the 30th January, for Mahukona, with a cargo of coal.

The schooner *James Townsend* is 23 days out from Humboldt, with a cargo of lumber for Messrs. Wilder & Co.

The *Fiona* cleared from New Castle, N.S.W., on the 17th February, for this port, with 2,028 tons of coal.

The bark *Priscilla* has been chartered to load coal from New Castle, N.S.W., for this port, to Messrs. Wilder & Co.

The Tern *Eva* from Humboldt, brought 302,873 feet of red-wood lumber, and 43,000 shingles to Messrs. Lewers & Cooke.

The *North Star* came into port yesterday to discharge her oil. The oil will be transhipped to San Francisco on the *Jane A. Falkenberg*.

The Bgtne. W. G. Irwin sailed for San Francisco yesterday. She carried away 9244 pkgs. of sugar, and 233 bunches bananas. Value domestic produce, \$80,615.07.

A heavy shower of hail-stones passed over a part of Nuuanu Valley and Palama on Monday evening, at about nine o'clock. It lasted about five minutes. The stones were nearly as large as a pea.

Shortly after leaving Auckland, he was detained 15 hours on account of fog. He says if it had not been for that detention, the steamer would have arrived here Sunday forenoon.

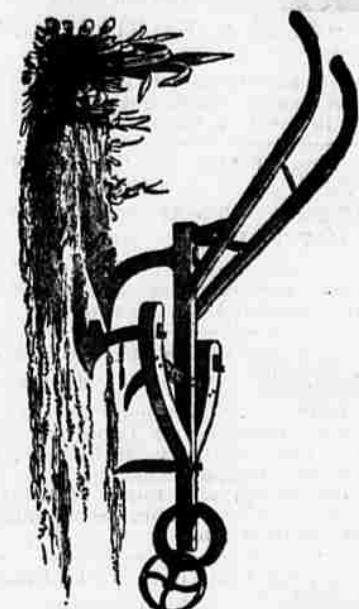

Late Foreign News.
When Her Majesty the Queen
was returning to Buckingham Palace
from a drive on February 1st, the
horses attached to her carriage be-
came restive, and bolted. The out-
rider was thrown and injured, but
the horses were stopped before any
further accident occurred. Her
Majesty was greatly alarmed but not
hurt.

Hitrono, the Russian Consul at
Bucharest, assured a deputation that
waited on him that Russia would
free the down-trodden slaves in
South-eastern Europe.

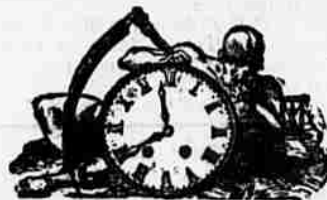
The Metropolitan of Moscow has
urged on the Emperor of Russia the
necessity of leaving the secluded
life which he has led since his acce-
sion to the throne.

The controversy that has taken
place in England as to whether the
construction of a tunnel under the
Channel from Dover to Calais is
likely to endanger the safety of
England, has attracted a great deal
of notice in France. The French
Press ridicule the alarm expressed
by Sir Garnet Wolseley and other
military authorities, and considers
that any fears on this ground are
perfectly needless.

The French troop in Tunis con-
tinue to meet with great opposition
in their attempts to suppress the in-
surrectionary movements through-
out the country. Several encounters
have taken place with the Arabian
insurgents, in which the French
troops were defeated.

Mrs. Scoville, the sister of Gui-
teau, and wife of the counsel who
defended him, has written to Mrs.
Garfield, widow of the murdered
President, on behalf of the prisoner,
whose sentence of death is fixed for
the 30th June. She appeals to Mrs.
Garfield to use her influence in ob-
taining a commutation of the sen-
tence, on the ground that her
brother was suffering from mental
aberration, and should not be held
responsible for the act.

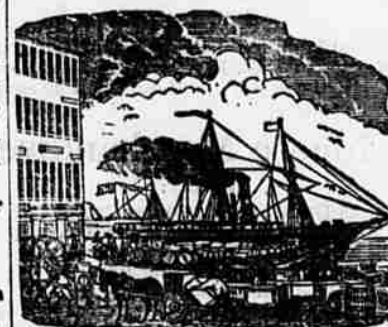
