

Wotje Atoll. The Japanese Government purchased the island of Wotje from the native chiefs, who owned the land, for the price of 10 sen per six square feet.

Ailuk Atoll. Land on which trade store and copra warehouse is situated was rented by the Japanese from Chief Lanaroj of Wotje. No land was purchased outright by the Japanese.

Mejit Atoll. Land where the dispensary is situated, from there to the beach, including the trade store, was rented by the Japanese and Germans. The Japanese paid 10 yen per month and the Germans paid \$5 per month. No land was purchased outright and no land is owned by foreign interests.

Utirik Atoll. No land is owned by foreign interests.

Rongelap Atoll. No land is owned by foreign interests.

Rongerik Atoll. Island to left of the pass on entering is said to be owned by the Japanese. It was given to the Japanese by Lapokij (brother of Lajore) for liquor. There are no documents to substantiate this transaction and it is doubtful if the transfer could be considered legitimate, considering the practice of the Japanese just before the war of occupying land for their purposes with only token gesture towards the owners.
