

(a) No field inspections were made during the month of December.

(b) Native Sanitary inspectors:

(1) None employed strictly as such. On Babelthuap the Village policemen are assigned additional duty as sanitary inspectors. On the islands of Koror and Arakabesan these inspections are made by the Sanitation Officer at frequent intervals.

(2) Number being trained and where: None at present. No results were obtained in recruiting campaign because no field trips were made.

(3) Nature and degree of supervision: None at present.

(d) Pest control:

(1) Insects:

Kayangel, Babelthuap, Koror and Arakabesan were not sprayed aerially this month. Mosquitoes were noted in large numbers on Babelthuap, and moderately on Koror and Arakabesan. Kayangel, Angaur, and Peleliu not observed. All heads on Koror and Arakabesan are sprayed once weekly with 5% DDT residual in kerosene. Good results in fly control are being obtained. 10% DDT powder is being used around galleys and dry provision store rooms for roach control with good results.

(2) Rodents:

Infestation appears minimal. A trapping campaign is under way in the Hospital area and in the BOQ area. Moderately good results are being obtained using bacon for bait.

(3) Other:

No other insects have been observed.

(e) Potable water supply:

The water supply is adequate in quality, but not in quantity. Greater water storage space is needed to assure an adequate supply over any such dry period as occurred in November. No water shortage actually occurred during December. All water is chlorinated.

(f) Violations of Sanitary regulations:

There were no violations.
