(d) Pest control: Measures taken and results: Previous report was erroneous in that no control measures were reported. It has been brought to the attention of this activity that the U.S. Commercial Company is furnishing the Aslito farm Co-op. and the Saipan Farm Co-op., with Metag for the control of the Giant African Snail. Results have not been observed. This reporting activity has no program in effect for the extermination of this pest, but since the primary need for control is in the farm areas to safeguard crops from damage by snails, the measures now in effect should prove benevicial.
