

(a) Field inspections by U.S.N. Personnel.

Field inspections are being made regularly, all ten districts being visited in July, and five in August and five in September. During July 82 villages were inspected; 55 in August and 55 in September. There has been a decided improvement in the Sanitary conditions in all districts. In July, 63 new pit-type latrines were completed and in operation, with 37 under construction and 18 over-water type completed and two under construction. In August, 6 pit-type completed, five under construction, 3 over-water type completed and 4 under construction. In September, 7 pit-type completed, 4 under construction, 7 over water type completed, and 6 under construction.

(b) Field Representatives:

(1) The native sanitation inspectors number seventeen, there being one for each district and some of the larger districts having two. The rate of pay is \$0.60 per day for a five day week.

(2) No sanitation inspectors under training, except for the bi-monthly meeting with the Sanitation and Medical Officers.

(3) Under direct supervision of the Sanitation Officer.

(c) Native Cereteries:

(1) Each village has their own cemetery which is maintained and cared for by the people.

(d) Pest Control:

(1) Insects - The station is being thoroughly sprayed 3 times a week with 5% DDT in kerosene, and there has been a noticeable decrease in the number of flies in and about the station. All pools of fresh water are either sprayed with diesel oil and DDT or drained and covered up. Very few mosquitoes noticed.

(e) During the past quarter the two wells have produced on the average of 7500 gallons per day, sufficient for all needs. It has not been necessary during this period to distill sea water.
