LOCAL NEWS.

To-morrow is Good Friday.

Mrs. Morris has moved her dress-making parlors to Adams lane.

Mr. J. Lyons holds his regular cash sale at ten o'clock this morning.

All Government offices will be closed to-morrow, it being Good Friday.

A rehearsal of the Fort Street Church choir will be held this evening.

A large number of young people visited H. B. M. S. Satellite yesterday afternoon.

The British bark Star of Devon arrived from Newcastle, N. S. W., yesterday afternoon.

The Bethel congregation held their weekly prayer-meeting in the Y. M. C. A. Hall last evening.

The Choral and Quintette Club will not meet to-night as usual, but a full attendance is requested a week hence.

The residence of P. C. Jones, on Nuuanu Avenue, is receiving a new coat of paint outside, giving it a very attractive appearance.

A three-masted schooner was reported off Coco Head yesterday afternoon, but instead of coming into port she proceeded southward.

No signs of the Mararoa up to midnight. The general opinion is that she has either broken down or has been detained at San Francisco.

A meeting of the W. C. T. U. will be held in the Y. M. C. A. parlor at half-past two o'clock this afternoon, to which a full attendance is requested.

Messrs. Quong Sam Kee & Co., who were burnt out by the late fire, have opened again in the store on King street formerly occupied by J. T. Waterhouse.

The Y. M. C. A. will hold their annual social in their hall this evening. The order of exercises will include an address by the retiring President. Brief reports from committees, refreshments, etc. A pleasant time may be expected. Members and their friends are requested to be present promptly at half past seven o'clock.

Tenders are asked for by F. A. Schaefer & Co., for the reconstruction of the building lately occupied by Messrs. Wing Wo Tai & Co., on Nuuanu street, which was destroyed by the late conflagration. A meeting of the Cabinet Council was held yesterday. Owing to the illness of Hon. Paul Neumann, the Attorney General, the Council convened at his residence on King street. There were present, His Majesty, His Excellency W. M. Gibson, Chas. T. Gulick, Minister of the Interior, and Hon. Paul Neumann, Attorney General. After transacting business of a general nature, a committee of five was appointed to investigate the cause of the late fire, and were further empowered so as to constitute a committee of general investigation to examine into all matters pertaining thereto, and report on the same. The following gentlemen were appointed: His Excellency Chas. T. Gulick, chairman, Mr. A. J. Cartwright, Mr. S. M. Damon, Mr. C. E. Williams, and Mr. C. O. Berger.

About eleven o'clock last Tuesday evening as Mr. Welsh, proprietor of the Commercial Saloon, on the corner of Nuuanu and Beretania streets, was closing up the saloon, a native boy named Kekapa was caught while robbing the money drawer in the upstairs bar-room. He was caught and a policeman called, who on arriving took the thief in charge. Mr. Welsh asked the officer to wait a moment until he could close the saloon and he would go to the Station House and make the charge against the prisoner. While Mr. Welsh was inside the prisoner broke away from the officer and was only caught after a hard chase. When caught no money could be found on him, he most probably having thrown it away while running. As it was, a bottle of whiskey was found in his possession, and he was locked up on a charge of larceny of a bottle of whiskey. He will be tried in the Police Court this morning.

Yesterday evening about half past six o'clock a Chinese express wagon which was loaded with Chinese goods was coming into town from the Palama way. The wagon was piled high with a miscellaneous lot of merchandise, which had been taken out of town during the fire. Just after the wagon had crossed the bridge the horse took fright at something among the ruins and ran away. The animal was stopped after he had run a distance of over a block across the burnt district, but not until the roughness of the ground had scattered most of the goods among the debris of fire.

The residents of Honolulu were again startled by the loud ringing of the fire bells at a little after one o'clock yesterday afternoon. Seeing the crowd running toward the Government building, a Press reporter joined the throng and was soon at the scene of the conflagration, which was in a small one-story dwelling house situated in the south-eastern extremity of the Government yard. The fire which started in one of the sleeping apartments, could have been extinguished with a few buckets of water and a little presence of mind, instead of calling out the Fire Department. On arriving on the scene a hackman and another person were hacking away at the roof of the cottage with axes. A moment later Volunteer Company No. 2 had water on the house. After letting the water run through one of the holes made in the roof of the house for about ten minutes the hose was withdrawn and the crowd dispersed. But little damage was done.

A meeting of the Honolulu Rifles was called at the armory last evening for dress inspection. After the inspection, the company marched to the Shooting Gallery, where a target practice was held. The following is the score in shooting order, each having five shots: Geo. McLeod, Captain, 15; H. Hebbard, First Lieutenant, 10; Wm. Unger, Second Lieutenant, 16; C. C. Ashford, Private, 13; W. A. S. Beales, 14; H. M. Dow, 10; Fagerroos, 12; J. Lucas, 14; J. F. Noble, 11; F. O'Brien, 10; J. H. Reid, 15; W. Rogers, 21; A. Robertson, 16; W. R. Simms, 16; W. P. Williams, 16; F. L. Winter, 12; G. K. Wilder, 13; W. C. Wilder Jr., 11; W. C. King, 12; Collins, 9; Kanaki, 9; C. T. Wilder, 9; Theo. Severin, 8.

They say: That a sorehead daily is soon to be started in Honolulu; that the Minister of the Interior has heeded the people's demand for a new fire limit; that the greater portion of Chinatown will be rebuilt soon; that the men who have tried to make political capital out of the fire-disaster have signally failed as they ought; that the public is lately informed that it was a newspaper man who deserves the credit and award of bravery in standing behind the sailor who stopped the blast which lay in the house that Jack didn't build; that some men have more cheek than ability; that most of the men who are so full of criticism about the fire did not even take their coats off to help put it out; that it is of little avail to protest against poor taste which is backed by egotism; that the natives are still ranking among the ruins in the hope of finding the remains of a "sack"; that the store of Wing Wo Tai & Co. on Nuuanu street will be rebuilt immediately; that the members of the next Legislature are beginning to arrive in town; that the contractors will be kept busy during the coming month making calculations and the estimates for new buildings; that the stores are selling lots of beautiful Easter cards; that Mr. T. G. Thurm has prepared a map of the burnt district; that the alarm of fire yesterday afternoon scared the remaining portion of Chinatown out of a year's growth; that somebody took a horseback ride last Sunday and had to walk back to Honolulu; that the Cabinet Council of yesterday appointed a fire committee of investigation; that the fire yesterday was a "shell"; that the different fire companies ought to have horses at their disposal; that the Mararoa has gone to the bottom; that H. B. M. S. Triumph will arrive here shortly; that the business portion of town will soon be overrun by Chinese; and that if it is, good-bye to Honolulu.

Action of the Minister of the Interior.

The following notice was posted at different places in the city day before yesterday: "NOTICE.

"Public notice is hereby given that the permanent repairing of any buildings damaged by the fire of the 18th inst., or the erection of any new building on the burnt district must be of brick, stone, iron, or other approved fire-proof material.

"The erection or permanent repairing of wooden structures is hereby strictly prohibited.

"Official surveys and plans of the burnt district having in view the widening, straightening and grading of the streets and lanes intersecting it are being prepared for the guidance of all parties interested as rapidly as possible and will be made public without delay.

"CHAS. T. GULICK, Minister of the Interior.

"Interior Office, April 20, 1886."

A circular has also been issued by the Minister of the Interior, of which the following is a copy:

"DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, Honolulu, April 20, 1886."

"To: 'SIR: You are hereby respectfully notified that surveys and plans of the district in this city burnt on the 18th instant, showing the streets, lanes, alleyways, etc., have been made, with a view to straighten, widen and grade the roadways of the district, and there is now in contemplation an ordinance or statute which will prohibit the erection of other than fire-proof buildings or structures within certain prescribed limits, and which will define necessary sanitary requirements with which all buildings must conform. These matters will be presented to the Legislative Assembly as soon as it meets for immediate action, and you are now notified to desist from erecting any structure on the above mentioned district of a permanent nature other than approved fire-proof material.

"You are further notified that you will be held responsible for any disregard of the above notice, and for the costs and expenses of any and all changes made necessary by your action.

"I have the honor to be, your obedient servant, CHAS. T. GULICK, Minister of the Interior."
