31,556,000 STUDENTS OF DEMOCRACY

America's army of education-31,556,000 strong, including children whose parents were born in every country in the world-went back to school last month to learn the ways of democracy.

Probably one of the most critical years in education in our history, as the world is battling over philosophies of government, the American educator will do more than ever before to inculcate into these students a deep-seated love and understanding of democracy as opposed to the dictatorship governments of European nations.

Reading, writing and 'rithmetic will still be taught, but even more important will be the teaching of freedom, liberty and democracy. Commenting on the plans for this year, John W. Studebaker, U.S. commissioner of education, said:

"Public and private schools may be expected to adapt their programs in 1941-42 to stress health and physical education, citizenship training, community, national and international relations, with particular emphasis on hemispheric solidarity. Schools this year will emphasize conservation of national resources more than ever before. They will explain in more detail the difference between dictatorships and democracies. Educational radio programs and forums will help to identify and endeavor to solve through public enlightenment and discussion, major problems affecting our citizens in their defense period. Defense savings programs also will be inaugurated."

Of course, in a democracy, Mr. Studebaker cannot dictate what the schools will teach, but from all over the nation reports indicate that school heads recognize their responsibility to fit education into the defense program.

The school enrollment this year—the number who will be exposed to education for defense and democracy-include 20,707,000 in elementary schools, 7,334,000 in secondary schools, 1,450,000 in institutions of higher learning, 100,000 in nurse training schools, 75,000 day students in business colleges and 1,850,000 part-time students.

If all of these students have the lesson of democracy drummed into them, it will do more than can armies and guns to safeguard our way of life.



Mrs. Trimble also recommended certain foods and household items of which an advanced supply should be stored up for a possible greater emergency period. Emphasis was placed on fumigation of cereals to prevent weevil infestation and importance of proper storage of all foods.

Measuring Club Success

Mrs. Elsie H. Hara, assistant home demonstration agent, pointed out and explained the various items on the regular 4-H score sheet, designed to assist leaders in measuring the success of their clubs.

Achievement Meetings

Miss Sylvia Newel, home demonstration agent, discussed the importance of the local achievement meetings, which are to be held in May. She urged making these achievement meetings community affairs, particularly to include all 4-H and adult University Ertension clubs in the community and to get as many parents of club members to attend as pos-

County Achievement Camp

Mr. Harvey Vollrath, county extension agent, explained briefly the purpose of the annual county achievement camp. May 16 and 17 was decided upon for the time and Hilo as the place for the next county achievement meeting.

One reason the teams are hesitant about entering the Commercial bracket is that Helcos have the cream of the crop in town, and there isn't another outfit that can match their power. The teams concede them the championship even before the season's opening, and those that enter go in merely to accommodate players of their own firm or business group and the question of whether or not they will win the championship is a secondary matter.

Someone suggested that the Helcos be split up, so that there will be more even competition among the teams, but this is unfair because Helcos are bonafide eligibles, and they should be allowed to compete if they so

It may be mentioned at this time that the Commercial loop is an open affair, with no restrictions placed on the calibre of players on the teams.

Some teams that have seen service in the senior bracket dropped out altogether and are competing in the Business division. They feel that as long as Helcos were in, they had better stay out.

The outlook, however, isn't entirely gloomy. Far from it. Entries have already bested last year's and the league is ready to pry open the lid. It's just that every possible effort is made to interest as many teams, so that this division can regain tis rightful place in the local orbit. Above others, the Commercials should provide color galore, with intense though friendly rivalry among the various business groups.

There may still be time for that in the future, and until then it is but to take advantage of the best that now exists.
