Telephone Call from Capt. John A. Holbrook, February 11, 1943, 4:05 pm

Capt. Holbrook - H

Lt. Pierce - P

H: I have been trying to get in touch with Captain Hall but I understand he is not available.

P: No, he's not and I'm answering the phone for him.

H: I want to give the report from out here at Rohwer. Do you want it all over the phone or just the figures?

P: Just give me the figures.

H: Here they are: The total number of form DSS 304A that were completed was 23. The total number of 126 Revised was 14. The number of volunteers for induction was four and of course they would be subtracted from the 23. How are some of the others making out.

P: Some are doing good and others not so good.

H: We were only able to handle 37 in that one day, processing is slow.

P: Do you expect experience to help speed it up?

H: We expect so. We are leaving the door open here so that they can come at any time.

P: That's good.

H: It's rather a question as to whether to take our time and get the job done right, I am worried about ~~the process~~ *missing some* I don't want ~~to take any more~~ *anyone. To say there were mistakes in the registration*

P: You are right on that, it is much better to do a careful job and get it done right.

H: Well, I will send along what I have, Goodby now.
