



And perhaps no city or rural paper reaches us from the farther lands which has not something of the kind to narrate growing out of the use of intexicating drinks though not often as tragical. Do not the monoty and the misery to be saved justify most amply any restriction of personal indulgence which prohibition may call for there or elsewhere.

If I was a hawse, I'd wish I was a kow, 'cause thes no work, but only loaf round eating all day. I like the hawse, and if I had one I would not let Jim Bunker ride on him, 'cause he makes mouths at my sister. You always can find a hawse in the street, and you can tell him because he has big eyes and a hed. The hawse has a flewing coal-scuttle—(sooks)
