Acquisitions for the Collections

Among recent gifts to the Academy, two are singled out for special mention. The Korean collection has acquired further significance with the addition of a rare pair of gold ear pendants of the Old Silla dynasty (5th–6th century), presented by Mrs. Robert P. Griffing, Jr. To our notable holdings of European laces have been added an important group of 17th and 18th century Flemish and French examples, including an exceptional piece of Point de France, donated by Messrs. Alvin W. Littwitz and Maxwell D. Littwitz of New York.

From the late summer exhibition of paintings by Kenzo Okada (American, born Japan 1902), the Academy purchased *Turn*, executed in 1962. Ten works by artists of Hawaii were acquired from the recent 17th annual exhibition: by Academy purchase— *In Front of Behind* (collage) and *Small Parks* (serigraph) by Barbara Engle, *Hawaiian Holiday* (serigraph) by Hon-Chew Hee, *Landscape*, *Hualalai* (oil) and *Still Life* (masonite intaglio) by John Kjargaard, *Gray Painting* (acrylic) by Ben Norris, untitled bronze sculpture by Peter Persson, *Guerre à Mort* (pen and ink) by Mike Phifer; by gift through the Watumull Foundation Purchase Awards—*Shadows, Rocks and Crabs* (mixed media print) by Louis Pohl; *Barn, San Juan Islands* (oil) by Willson Y. Stamper.

Isami Doi Memorial Exhibition

Marking the first anniversary of the death of Isami Doi, nationally known Kauai artist, a major retrospective of his work will open at the Academy on December 1. Oils, pastels, watercolors, woodcuts, drawings and jewelry—drawn from private and public collections—will be presented in this comprehensive exhibition illustrating the unique qualities of a talent and personality long held in high esteem in the Islands. A catalogue will accompany the show.

Recent Drawings by Edward Stasack

This mid-December exhibition is composed of a recent series of pen and ink drawings by Edward Stasack, who has received national recognition for his work in graphic media as well as painting. Mr. Stasack is an Assistant Professor of Art at the University of Hawaii and has been a member of that department for the past 10 years.

Holiday Tables

The Women's Committee will present a special event, for the benefit of the Academy's acquisition fund, opening on November 17 with a preview reception. *Holiday Tables* will feature a number of artfully designed seasonal decorations and settings prepared by invited experts. Opening night tickets are \$3.50 for the public and \$2.50 for Academy Members. Paintings by Reuben Tam

An exhibition of paintings by Kauai-born artist Reuben Tam will be shown at the Academy beginning in early January through the courtesy of the Landau–Alan Gallery, New York City, and the Little Gallery, Honolulu. For many years Mr. Tam has been living and working in New York City, where he has received a high degree of critical acclaim. His works have been seen in numerous national exhibitions and are found in private and public collections throughout the United States.
