lear Mr. Secretary:



In accordance with my undertaking yesterday there are attached hereto drafts of:

- a. A proposed communication to the Japanese Government, notifying them of the steps to be texen in the event they wish to proceed with the surrender.
- b. A proclamation to be published by the Emperor of Japan, signed by him and by the Japanese Imperial General Headquarters, which socopts the terms set furth in the Petedan proclamation, and proclaims the unconditional surrender of the Japanese erzed forces.
- desequenters, upon the direction of the Esperor, which directs Japanese enumenders to approach the various allied equantiers and surrender their forces. It also directs as to other dutails of the surrender. This draft of "General Order So. 1" will be given the Supreme Sommender of the Allied Powers with instructions that he will use it as a comprehensive guide in the formulation of the first order to be issued by the Imperial General Scade warters, but that he will be free to alter its details to make it applicable to the directors existing at the time the formula arrander takes place, or to paralt proper translation.
- e. A proposed directive to the Supreme Commander of the Allied Powers which it is considered should be issued at the proper time by the President on behalf of the Four Powers.



If the Japanese Government wishes to effect the surrender in secondance with the foregoing it should immediately:

- (1) Direct constition of hostilities by Japanese forces, informing the Supreme Gommander of the Allied Powers of the effective date and hour of such constition.
- Powers with information of the disposition of the Japanese forces and semmendars, and fully empowered to make any arrangements directed by the Supreme Commender of the Allied Powers to enable his and his accompanying forces to arrive at the place designated by him to receive the formal surrender.

For the purpose of receiving such surrender and carrying it into effect, General of the Army Bouglas ManArthur has been designated as the Supreme Commander of the Allied Powers, and he will notify the Japanese Go ernment of the time, place and other details of the formal surrender.

Pailure to notify the Supreme Commander of your intention immediately to effect the surrender as outlined above will result in the continuation of full scale military operations by the Allied Powers.





PROCLAMATION B. THE EMPERSE OF JULY

- 1. - I. The Imperial General Headquarters by direction of the Emperor, and pursuant to the surrender to the Supreme Commander of the Allied Pewers of all Japanese armed forces by the Emperor, hereby orders all of its commanders in Japan and abroad to cause the Japanese armed forces and Japanese-controlled forces under their command to cease hostilities at once, to lay down their arms, to remain in their present locations and to surrender unconditionally to commanders acting on behalf of the United States, the Republic of China, the United Kingdom and the British Empire, and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, as indicated hereafter. Immediate contact will be made with the indicated commanders, or their designated representatives, and their instructions will be completely and immediately carried out.
- a. The senior Japanese commanders and all ground, sea, air and auxiliary forces within China, e cluding Menchuria, Formosa and French Indo-China morth of 160 north latitude shall surrender to the Jeneralissimo Chiang Kai-shek.
- b. The senior Japanese commanders and all ground, sea, air and auxiliary forces within Manchuria, Morea north of the 38° north latitude and Karafuto shall surrender to the Commander-in-Chief of Soviet Forces in the Far East.



- e. The senior Jepamese occasenders and all ground, see, air and auxiliary forces within Tailand, Surme, Malaya, French Lido-Crime south of 15 morth latitude, Sumatra, Jevi, Andamars, Micobars, Bornes and the Lessar Sundas small surrement to the Sumress Alaled Competers, Southeast Asia Command.

- II. The Japanese is erial General Headquarters shall furnish to the Su rems Commanier of the Allied Preers, within (time limit) of receipt of this order, complete information with respect to Ja an and all areas more Japanese soutron, as follows:
- a. Lists of all lead, air and enti-eircraft units showing locations and strongths in officers and sen.
- b. Lists of all sireraft, military, neval and civil, giving complete information as to the number, type, location and condition of much mireraft.
- c. Lists of all Japanese and Ja anese-controlled naval vessels, surface and submarine and auxiliary naval craft in or out of commission and under construction giving their position, some time and novement.
- d. Lists of all Jaconese and Japanese-controlled serobent ships of over 100 gross tons, in or out of sommission and under sometraction,



including aerchant ships formerly belonging to any of the United Mations which are now in Japanese sands, giving their position, consistion and movement.

- e. Complete and detailed information, accompanied by maps, showing locations and layouts of all mines, misefields and other obstacles to movement by land, see or air, and the sefety lanes in commection therewith.

VIII. The manufacture and distribution of all arms, ammunition and implements of war will cause forthwith.

II. With respect to United Sations prisoners of ar and civilian interness in the hands of Japanese or Jamness-controlled authorities:

a. The safety and well-being of all inited Nations prisoners of war and dividing internees will be acrupulously preserved, to include the administrative and supply services essential to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, and sedical care until such responsibility is undertaken by the Supreme Commander of the Allied Powers;

- III. This and all subsequent instructions issued by the Su rese Commander of the Allied Forces or other allied military authorities will be scrupulously and promptly obeyed by Japanese and Japanese-controlled military and civil officials and private persons. Any delay or failure to comply with the



Commander of the Allied Powers determines to be detrimental to the Allied Powers, will incur drastic and summary punisment at the hands of all ad military authorities and the Japanese Government.
