MONTHLY MUNICIPAL MARKET AND
PARIETY SCHOWS

Last Saturday on July 31, 1954 there were market and pariety shows given by the people of Airai. These market and shows were almost the same as the one which were given by the Paleliu people, last month. They called it the Monthly Municipal Market because it is a kind of market which is given by the people of villages at the end of every month.

The market started at 9:00 A. M. and was over at 4:00 P. M. There were many good things and delicious food prepared by the people of Airai. Most of them were sold by the stateside people and many other guests at the very good prices. A great income was brought to the people of Airai Municipality. The total amount was \$143.21 for only the materials which was sold, but they don't have to take all of this money, ten per cent will be taken by the Community Center.

On the same night there was a show also given by the people of Airai. The show was very nice and the abai was crowded with the stateside people and many other guests. The commission was 25¢ for the stateside and 20¢ for the Palauan adults and 10¢ for the childrens. The total amount for only the show was \$ 78.00 .

The show was really good especially a girl from Airai whose name is Erika, she is a very good dancer. She was the leader of the Airai young ladies dancers. I think she could be one of the famous Palauan actress some day.

It is a good thing to have this kind of market every month, because if we make many good things to be sold at the market it will bring a great amount of money to each of our villages.

The Airai people earned \$221.21 from their market, \$22.21 was taken by the Community Center, and \$199.09 was brought to Airai.

The next market will be given by the people of Aimeliik Municipality. It is going to be held on August 24th 1954. There will be many good things and foods to be sold at the market. Please come everybody and help your self.
