SUBJECT: Incongruity of municipal boundary lines between Ngiwal and Ngaraard Municipalities, Palau District

In response to inquiries from Palau District, this Office has had occasion to review the municipal charters for Ngiwal and Ngaraard Municipalities as approved, respectively, on July 9 and November 26, 1958. Our cursory review of the two municipal charters indicates overlapping of boundary lines between Ngiwal and Ngaraard Municipalities on the eastern shore of Babelthaup where the two municipalities meet. Our opinion is based on the U.S.G.S.Army map (AMS W856) of 1954 which utilized the horizontal and vertical control established by the Corps of Engineering, 1951. Copies of the geographic boundaries of the two municipalities in question as set forth in the respective charters are enclosed for your comparative analyses and information).

If you will note, the Ngaraard Municipal Charter describes the southern boundaries of that municipality as running "...south along the eastern limit of territorial waters to a point known as Ngeit; on the South, westerly from Ngeit to the eastern shore of Babelthuap at Bkul Ngerair and thence westerly following the Kedidiul Ngerair ridge to-Ongelulliwal Peak ..." (emphasis supplied).

In the Charter for Ngiwal Municipality, a document approved some five months later, the northern geographic boundary of that municipality is stipulated to run from a "...concrete marker located at Brsechel, thence to the concrete marker located on Bkul Ngerair Point and proceeding northeast along the high water mark to the estuary known as Taoch era Idelui, continuing east down that estuary to a point on the eastern limit of territorial waters opposite the channel known as Ngeit; on the East, proceeding southward along the eastern limit of territorial waters from the point opposite Ngeit channel to a point opposite the channel known as Meteultowachel; ..." (emphasis supplied).

For historical and practical reasons, municipal boundaries for municipalities in Palau District can be quite sensitive and politically explosive, and this Office is interested in eliminating possible conflicts

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178.54.4 Oction- Mayo between municipalities due to boundary disputes. In this particular instance, it is obvious to us that through some oversight the boundaries between Ngaraard and Ngiwal Municipalities appear to be overlapping. We therefore think that this should be rectified to preclude future friction between the two municipalities.

In this regard, we are advised that the cadastral survey of Babelthaup is presently underway, and we would like to request that your office furnish us with the technical description of the geographic boundaries of both municipalities insofar as they overlap on the ocean side at the points bound by the Bkul Ngerair Point to the estuary of Taoch ra Ideleui to the eastern limit of Territorial waters off Ngeit point and back to Bkul Ngerair. Please also furnish us with an appropriate map (detailed enough to show physical characteristics of the area) showing the overlapping boundaries in two different colors.

Please let us know if you require further clarification of our request.

CHARTER

FUNICIPALITY OF NGIWAL.

PREAMBLE

- MHEREAS by unaimmous vote of their Hunicipal Council, the people of Ngiwal have expressed their desire for representation in the government of their land in accordance with principles proclaimed in the Trusteeship Agreement and under the laws of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, and
- MMEREAS we have confidence in the ability of these people to discharge certain responsibilities of government under our laws and the provisions of this Charter,
- NOW THEREFORE, I, Delmas H. Mucker, High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, pursuant to Section h2 of the Code of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and the anthority vested in mc, do hereby Charter the people of Sgival to exercise the authority of government over the areas hereinafter described in accordance with the following Articles and do hereby proclaim that their government shall be known as
- THE MUNICIPALITI OF NGIMAL, the geographic boundaries of which are described as: On the North from Ngelsum mountain proceeding easterly along with the ridge immediately south of the point known as Uchulaisau and passing through Ulebuuteltilel, ilebiong and Eglairang, thence to the top of Ongeduliraard mountain and continuing over the peak of Ongeduliwal down the Kedidiul-Egerair to the concrete marker located at Ercechel, thence to the concrete marker located on Bkul Ngerair Point and proceeding northeast along the high water mark to the estuary known as Taoch era Idelui, continuing east cown that estuary to a point on the eastern limit of territorial waters opposite the channel known as Ngeit; on the East, proceeding southward along the eastern limit of territorial waters from the point opposite Ngeit channel to a point opposite the channel known as Meteultowachel; on the South, westerly from the point on the eastern limit of territorial waters opposite Meteultowachel, entering this channel south of Ikes islet and continuing to the shore at the point known as Implech, thence west through Altalbtaches to the peak of Oidabeluochel; on the West, from Oidabeluochel peak northward across Hgel mountain to the top of Ngelsum mountain.

ARTICLE I

This Charter and all amendments hereto constitute a part of the Laws of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

ARTICLE II

Organization

The Municipal Government shall be composed of:

Section 1. A Magistrate who shall be the chief executive officer of the Municipality, whose duties shall include but not be limited to

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NOW THERIFORS, I, Delmas H. Nucker, High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, pursuant to Section h2 of the Code of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and the authority vested in me, do hereby Charter the people of Ngaraard to exercise the authority of government over the areas hereinafter described in accordance with the following Articles and do hereby proclaim that their government shall be known as

THE MUNICIPALITY OF NGARAARD, the geographic boundaries of which are described as: on the North from point known as Masech on the western limits of territorial waters on the Philippine Sea, southeasterly to a point in the lagoon known as Rsaol thence easterly across Ngarhelong (Arekalong) peninsula at its narrowest point which is known as Rrenged, and continuing to the eastern limits of territorial waters on the Pacific Ocean at a point known as Ongesachel; on the east from Ongesachel south along the eastern limit of territorial waters to a point known as Ngeit; on the South, westerly from Ngeit to the eastern shore of Babelthaup at Ekul Ngerair and thence westerly following the Medidial Ngerair ridge to Ongedullival Peak thence across Ongedullrrard Peak to the top of Ngelsum mountain; on the west from Ngelsum mountain proceeding in a northerly direction along the ridge passing over the peak of Uchulaisau and east of Ikeyam mountain to the source of and thence down the river Ralmraitoi to a point known as Ngchewang, thence, northwest along Towachal Ongekiuul passage to the western limits of the territorial waters in the Philippine Sea to a point known as Ngemechii and thence north along these western limits to the point known as Masech.

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Organization

The Municipal Government shall be composed of:

thence, N 060-42'-33"E 39.27 meters to a cross mark on concrete drain; corner #3

thence, N 40°-51°23"E 3.34 meters to a cross mark on concrete drain; corner #4

thence, S 860-13'-58"E 47.46 meters to a cross mark on concrete ditch; corner #5

thence, S 050-33'51"W 39.93 meters to a cross mark on concrete drain; corner #6

thence, N 850-47'-53"W 0.93 meters to a concrete monument; corner #7

thence, westerly on the arc of circle 155.91 meters in radius, concave to the left an arc distance 45.01 meters along the northerly line of Koror Main Road, the chord of said arc running \$ \$50-55'55'W, 44.85 meters to a mark on concrete which is the point of the beginning, containing an area of 2090.00 square miles and as shown in Map PK-18.8 Serial No. 155.

All bearings are based on the 1955 Land and Claim triangulation surveys.

The above description was written on December 10, 1958 by Taro Ngiraingas, Assistant Surveyor and Cartographic Engineer, Palau District, from data secured by a survey made by said Taro Ngiraingas in November-December 1958.

Reserving therefrom, however, the right, title and interest in and to all areas of said land which may be required for public roads, rights-of-way, easements, mineral rights, and uses essential for the public welfare.

To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said Municipality of Koror, its successor and assigns, forever.

Subject: Inquiry as to Status of the Requests of the Olbil era Kelulau and Koror Municipality for Title to Certain Tracts of Public Land

Many months ago requests were forwarded to the High Commissioner on behalf of the Palau Congress (OEK) and Koror Municipality for title to certain percels of land located in Koror upon which their buildings were located. These included the Community Center area, "old Congress Building" and Asahi ballfield for the Olbill Fra Kelulau and for Koror Municipality, the site of their new office opposite the Administration building. It is my understanding that both requests were approved by the High Commissioner with my one recommended provise that in the case of the "Old Congress Building" the OEK be granted a homesteed rather than a quitclain deed, the transfer of title contingent on their rehabilitating the large concrete ruin located on the site. The rehabilitating the large concrete ruin located on the site. The Cartographic Engineer visited Falsa last year to instruct our survey crew in the surveying and preparation of the technical description of the percels.

Here the record fades altogether. I believe the maps and descriptions are in Guam and have been for some time. I seem to recall your once saying that "all the papers" were on your desk. Do you have any knowledge of this matter, or where it now reste?
