

Latest Foreign News.

The schooner Anna arrived yesterday, 14 days from San Francisco. She brought papers of the 6th inst., from

which we clip the following items: Guiteau was sentenced on the 4th instant; to be hung on Friday the 80th

of June, 1882. Violent snow storms are reported in the East. Traffic is impeded.

The ship Sir Lancelot arrived at As-toria on the 5th instant.

A bill was introduced into the Senate at Washington, on the 6th inst., for the appointment of an Interoceanic Com-mission to determine the best plan and route for communication between the Atlantic and Pacific.

The Pacific Coast Steamship Comp-any's property was transferred to the Oregon Railroad and Navigation Company, on the 4th instant.

Fears are entertained in New York for the safety of the steamer City of Limerick, seven days overdue from Liverpool.

Counterfeit half dollars, bearing date of 1877, and purporting to be coined at the Philadelphia Mint, are in circulation in San Francisco.

A telegram, dated Washington, Feb. 4th, says: Congress will probably make short work of any attempt to admit New Mexico into the Union as a State.

Memorial services, in memory of the late President Garfield, will be held in the Capitol at Washington on the 27th inst.

A London telegram of Feb. 6th, states that great alarm is felt in England, over the Channel Tunnel Scheme, and that every member of the Cabinet, ex-cept Bright, and perhaps Chamberlain, are against the project.

Artesian wells are being sunk in vari-ous parts of New South Wales.

Small-pox is prevalent in Sydney, Mel-bourne, and South Australia.

'Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Cannaught has given birth to a Princess.

A disastrous explosion took place on board H. M. S. Triumph, stationed at Chill. A large quantity of xenotime siccative exploded, killing three men and injuring seven others.

The gross yield of wheat in New South Wales is estimated at four million bushels.


