- 1. Reference is made to the following letters from this office:
- g. SPI 342 (1-28-43) FR-I, dated Pebruary 1, 1943, subject; "Induc- tion of United States Citizens of Japanese Ancestry".
- h. AG 342 (4-15-43) PR-I-A, dated April 23, 1943, subject: "Indus-Stion of United States Citizens of Japanese Angestry Qualifications".
- 2. United States citizens of Japanese ancestry who were rejected because they did not qualify physically for general service as provided in reference letter, paragraph is, but who apparently can meet the physical standards for special assignment as provided in reference letter, paragraph is, may be returned to the induction station by their local Selective Service boards for regrammation. If myon regrammation they are found qualified for either general service or special assignment, they will be inducted.
- 3. Upon receipt of these instructions commending efficers of each armed forces induction station at which a United States sitisen of Japanese ancestry has been rejected will, if such rejected selectes appears eligible for reexamination under the provisions of paragraph 2 above, notify the selectes's local Selective Service board that he may be returned for another induction examination.
- 4. A special report will be submitted to The Adjutant General under restricted classification enowing the number of United States citizens of Japanese accepty industed under the provisions of letters referred to in paragraph 1, through April 30, 1948.
