Subject: Induction of United States Citizens  
of Japanese AncestryTo: Commanding General,  
Seventh Service Command,  
Army Service Forces,  
Omaha, Nebraska.

1. Reference is made to the following letters from this office:

a. SPI 342 (1-28-43) PR-I, dated February 1, 1943, subject: "Induction of United States Citizens of Japanese Ancestry".

b. AG 342 (4-15-43) PR-I-A, dated April 23, 1943, subject: "Induction of United States Citizens of Japanese Ancestry - Qualifications".

2. United States citizens of Japanese ancestry who were rejected because they did not qualify physically for general service as provided in reference letter, paragraph 1g, but who apparently can meet the physical standards for special assignment as provided in reference letter, paragraph 1h, may be returned to the induction station by their local Selective Service boards for reexamination. If upon reexamination they are found qualified for either general service or special assignment, they will be inducted.

3. Upon receipt of these instructions commanding officers of each armed forces induction station at which a United States citizen of Japanese ancestry has been rejected will, if such rejected selectee appears eligible for reexamination under the provisions of paragraph 2 above, notify the selectee's local Selective Service board that he may be returned for another induction examination.

4. A special report will be submitted to The Adjutant General under restricted classification showing the number of United States citizens of Japanese ancestry inducted under the provisions of letters referred to in paragraph 1, through April 30, 1943.
