## NEW LAW LIBRARY OPENS ON DOLE ST.

The new Law Library was dedicated on January 14. The following is some info on what to expect this semester:

Library Hours: Jan. 17 - May 14

Mon. - Fri.: 8:00am - 12:00 mid.

Saturday: 10:00am - 10:00pm

Sunday: 1:00pm - 12:00 mid.

Holiday hours to be posted.

The circulation desk closes at 10:00pm every nite. This schedule is subject to change because of budget restriants.

The 2nd - 5th floors of the parking structure is locked at 10:00pm every nite. If you plan to stay late, park on the first floor (the elevators run 24 hours).

Carrels: The library is equipped with beautiful new carrels. The carrels are larger than the ones in the old facility. Each carrel has its own lamp and electrical outlet. However, no coffee pots and hot plates will be allowed. Carrels are being assigned by a lottery system. Each student will be able to draw a number at the circulation desk which corresponds to a carrel and a locker. You will have till Jan. 31 to make a mutual change of carrels with another student, after that date carrel assignments become permenant.

Circulation: The library will still operate on the open reserve system. There are more copies of each regional reporter in the stacks. This will provide greater resources for students doing research (Appelate Advocacy, Seminar papers ?!#\$%!). Most of the books that were on close reserve are out. There will be only a limited selection of books on close reserve. Books that can be circulated will have a blue slip inside the back cover.

Misc.: The same xerox machine "Old (un)Faithful" is still in operation. The administration is looking into the possibility of leasing another machine. Handouts can be picked up at the circulation desk.

Kokua: The library is going thru a difficult period of transition. Policies are still be developed as the need arises. Cooperation and patience is needed from the law school community.
