BLAND ON SILVER COINAGE.

Washington, Dec. 29.-Representative Bland, chairman of the House Committee on Coinage, Weights and Measures, was interviewed to-day and in response to a question whether any act for the restriction of silver coinage would be passed this session, answered: "No, sir; not much. I suppose efforts will be made in that direction, but when the enemies of silver see that they can neither stop nor restrict its coinage below the existing law, perhaps they will consent to a sensible solution of the whole question, which is unlimited coinage. Silver only suffers in com-parison with gold now because it is restricted, debarred, discredited and kicked about by law. Provide for unlimited coinage and it will then be equal to gold in all respects. We must come to that eventually, and the sooner the better."—S. F. Call.

Mr. Samuel Parker, with his usual kindness and fore-thought, arranged for the Pele to proceed outside the harbor yesterday to enable friends of departing friends to remain as long as possible, on the Mariposa. Before leaving the steamer Mr. Adolph Spreckels invited the stop-at-homes to a parting glass of champagne, and His Excellency Mr. Paul Neumann proposed "The noblest Roman of them all, Sam Parker." It is needless to say kow this was received. As Mr. Berger left the Pele, the band boys played the beautiful German hymn. "What's become of the World If nobody drinks." The last selection given by the band was "Till we meet again," as the giant and the dwarf steamers parted company. At one o'clock the Mariposa fired a gun and she was last seen rounding Diamond Head. Among the gentlemen present on board the Mariposa were His Ex. Paul Neumann, His Ex. J. M. Kapena, The Governor of Oahu Prison (whom everybody wished to be friends with), Captain Hayley, Messrs. G. W. and E. C. Macfarlane, W. G. Irwin, S. Parker, J. Grant, Consul McKinley and Judge Widemann.

His Excellency the Attorney-General might have been lost to the community yesterday but for the tender care of a man with a thicker skull. The A. G. recklessly waived his hat to his parting friends, regardless of the hot Hawaiian un pouring its rays upon his venerable hend. A thicker skulled newspaper nan, who did not again wish the country to be without an A. 


