

Dear Mr. McCloy:

I have your letter of November 3 sending me a copy of a tentative revision of the "Standard Operating Procedure for Military Police at Tule Lake Center" dated 15 October 1943. I have noted that the tentative revision incorporates many, but not all, of my suggestions sent you in my letter of September 27.

Since your letter of November 3 was sent me, the Project Director of the Tule Lake Center, as you know, has asked the Commanding Officer in charge of the military police contingent at the Tule Lake Center to assume responsibility for maintaining order within the Center, and the Commanding Officer has assumed that responsibility. Mr. Robert B. Cozzens, our Assistant Director in San Francisco, has been holding discussions with Army officers of the Western Defense Command, and I have authorized Mr. Cozzens over the telephone to work out a new agreement on the Army's relationship to the Tule Lake Center. I understand that the terms of the proposed agreement will cover some of the subjects now covered in the Standard Operating Procedure. I should like, therefore, to delay further reply to your letter of November 3 until after the discussions now in progress at San Francisco have resulted in a new agreement. I trust that will be satisfactory to you.
