We have to record an unusually quiet week, with very little transpiring worthy of note.

The real estate sale on Saturday last comprising four lots belonging to the estate of the late R. C. Wyne, realized rather low figures, though the parcels were not very eligibly located nor the buildings in good condition. The following were the sales:

On Monday, the following lots, belonging to the Adam's estate, were sold:

No. 1.—Seven and a half acres of land, near Kalihi bridge, \$4000. E. Burgess.

No. 2.—One and a quarter acres of land on the Ewa road, \$100. E. Burgess.

No. 3.—One half acre of kula land on the Kalihi stream, \$50. W. Adams.

The three latter parcels realized very good prices.

BIENNIAL REPORT

OF THE
Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
to the Legislature of 1866.

NOTES and Representatives:

In conformity to the law establishing the Ju-
diciary Department, I have the honor to submit to
the Legislature a report of its administration,
and business for the last biennial period.

I have taken the liberty to call your attention to some modifications in the laws which more
especially bear on the domestic relations and
morality of the people, and also upon some other
matters of a general character.
