THE SCIENCE OF ROADS.

SEVENTEEN RULES BY AN ASSOCIATION OF LONDON.

Paints Must Be Renewed Without Delay—Advice as to Materials and Methods.

The Road Improvement Association of London, England, recently issued a circular containing seventeen rules for the guidance of roadmasters in keeping macadam and telford roads in proper repair, as follows:

1. Never allow a hollow, a rut or a puddle to remain on a road, but fill it up at once with chips from the stone heap.

2. Always use chips for patching and for all repairs during the summer season.

3. Never put fresh stones on the road if, by cross-picking and a thorough use of the rake, the surface can be made smooth and kept at the proper strength and section.

4. Remember that the rake is the most useful tool in your collection, and it should be kept at hand the whole year around.

5. Do not spread large patches of stone over the whole width of the road, but coat the middle or horse track first, and when this has worn in coat each of the sides in turn.

6. In moderately dry weather and on hard roads always pick up the old surface into ridges six inches apart, and remove all loose and projecting stones before applying a new coating.

7. Never spread stones more than one stone deep, but add a second layer when the first has worn in, if one coat be not enough.

8. Never shoot stones on the road and crack them where they lie, or a smooth surface will be out of the question.

9. Never put a stone upon the road for repairing purposes that will not freely pass in every direction through a two-inch ring, and remember that smaller stones should be used for patching and for all slight repairs.

10. Recollect that hard stones should be broken to finer gauge than soft, but that that the two-inch gauge is the largest that should be used under any circumstances where no steam roller is employed.

11. Never be without your ring gauge; remember Macadam's advice, that any stone you could not put in your mouth should be broken smaller.

12. Use chips, if possible, for binding newly-laid stones together, and remember that road sweepings, horse droppings, soot, or grass and

other rubbish, when used for this purpose, will ruin the best road ever constructed.

13. Remember that water-worn or rounded stones should never be used upon steep gradients, or they will fail to bind together.

14. Never allow dust or mud to lie on the surface, for either of these will double the cost of maintenance.

15. Recollect that dust becomes mud at the first shower, and that mud forms a wet blanket which will keep the road in a filthy condition for weeks at a time, instead of allowing it to dry in a few hours.

16. Remember that the middle of the road should always be a little higher than the sides, so that rain may run into the side gutters at once.

17. Never allow the water tables, gutters and ditches to clog up, but keep them clear the whole year through.

Every roadmaster and supervisor should cut these rules out and paste them in his everyday hat. To make a good road is one thing, and to keep it in good repair is quite another thing.

The fine roads in Europe are the result of a splendid repair system, where every defect is promptly corrected before it has time to cause serious damage to the highway.

BRASS SIGNS IN NEW YORK.

Probably Half a Million Dollars Invested in This Sort of Ornamentation.

A stroll along Broadway early in the morning discloses an army of men engaged in polishing the brass signs that flank the entrance of the stores, and the same sight may be noted on Sixth avenue or any of the other principal business streets. Walk down one of these thoroughfares an hour later, and the rays of the sun, reflected from thousands of burnished surfaces, make bright for the day by vigorous rubbing, dance about you and dazzle your eyes. In fact, commercial New York is a city of brass signs.

The other day a South Fifth avenue maker was asked if he could give an estimate of the amount of money invested in these "standing ads."

"Well," he replied, "a door sign of brass costs from \$25 to \$150, according to its size, lettering and border designs. Of course you can get small office signs for less money, but I am speaking of those used by merchants, bankers and that class of people. Take some large stores, and you will notice they are literally bordered with brass signs at the entrances and long signs beneath the big show windows. A display of that sort represents an outlay of from anywhere between \$500 and \$2,000. From the local business our firm does a great deal of work for the New York city has \$500,000 invested in brass signs."

NEW CENTRAL STATION.

PROSPECTS FOR THE MUCH NEEDED CITY FIRE HOUSE.

Plans are being made for a new fire station and fire house on the corner of Beretania and Fort streets.

Honolulu has good prospects for a big, central fire station to be built this spring. No. 2 company will occupy it. The old building on Union street will then be returned to the Monarrat estate, from which it has been rented.

Chief Hunt has worked hard for this Central station. Years ago he began to urge it, and his petitions, recommendations and estimates on the subject would fill a basket.

The necessity for such a structure has been long conceded by the government, but other matters have invariably frustrated plans for the building of it. But this time, it is expected to go through.

Plans are under way in the Survey department. Mr. Rowell has the matter in charge. Chief Hunt has embodied invaluable suggestions in the general plans. The whole matter will be submitted to the Legislature at its approaching session and will doubtless be approved.

The Central Station is to be erected on the lot at the corner of Beretania and Fort streets, now leased by Wirth's circus. On account of the proposed widening of Beretania street, ten feet will be left on the town side of the lot. It will be the building 100x200 feet in size. It will be two stories high, of brick with handsome stone fronts on both streets.

Two engines, with hose carts, reels, hook and ladder appliances, etc., will be kept in the Central Station. There will be two exits on each street, or four in all. The Chief's office will occupy the corner at Beretania and Fort. The estimated cost of the building is \$85,000. A rental of \$50 per month is paid on the old building in Union street. Besides, repairs have to be kept up. The street is very narrow and is hard to leave on a run.

No change will be made in the present arrangements at Nos. 1 and 3 fire houses.

NEW WASH HOUSE.
One Complete Place All Ready for Occupancy.

The new Government wash house at Iwilei is finished. It is 300 feet long and 10 feet wide. There are twenty rooms in it. The building is two stories high. There is a concrete floor over a width of 12 feet running the whole length of the house. A drain is laid down the center so that the building can be flushed out to the sea. The wash rooms have a length of 18 feet.

This arrangement will do away with separate fires that had to be kept up in the rooms of the old house. All of the washmen from the old house will at once be moved to Iwilei.
