MORNING.

Meeting Stock Exchange, at 11. EVENING. Oahu Lodge, No. 1 K. of P. 7:30. Bethel Prayer Meeting, at7:30. Fort St. Church, Prayer Meeting at 7:30.

St. Andrew's Cathedral, usual services, 7:30.

A PLEASANT PARTY

Visited Waimanalo; at the invitation of Hon. J. Cummins, on Friday last. An early start was made, Col. Judd and Miss Webster leading the way, followed by about twenty ladies and gentlemen in buggies or on horseback, among whom were Mrs. Brown, Misses Fannie and May Fargo, Miss Beaudet, Captain Morse, Colonel J. H. Boyd, Herr Bandmann and Mr. Sutton.

At nine o'clock the cavalcade started from the Hawaiian Hotel, and, after passing the dreaded pali in safety, were invited to partake of Hawaiian hospitality at Col. Boyd's country residence. The party partook, and, instead of Australian bush damper and tea, were astounded to find iced champagne awaiting them. Waimanalo was reached at noon and the beautiful scenery much admired by the strangers on our shores. Tiffin over, an inspection was made of the mill and its mechanism, the house, which divided from itself, cannot fall, and the cottages of the

King Kalakaua, arrived with Col. Boyd, a few hours later. His Majesty, attired in a dark blue suit with a crimson sash, and covered with lais, looked like a "knight of ancient times," and was received with vociferous cheers and the national anthem, Hawaii Ponoi. He was glad to see Bandmann in his shirt sleeves (it being rather sultry) and said it was "liberty hall here." All the ladies were provided with kalakoas, a great relief to them after their long and warm ride. At halfpast five the party had dinner an naturel, every native and European dish being placed before the guests. Natives were singing and dancing during all the meals, and, after dinner, His Majesty's dancers performed the hula kui. Mrs. Brown and Miss Beaudet, at His Majesty's request, sang several songs, and Herr Bandmann, at the royal command, recited something serious in preference to humorous. that it "might instruct his people" who thronged around the doors and windows. Eugene Aram's dream was given and received with prolonged applause.

Dancing was the next order of the evening, His Majesty opening the first quadrille with Miss Webster. The party was regaled with cakes, coffee and wine by Hon. John Cummins, the "Prince of Entertainers," ably assisted in his courteous attention by Colonel Judd. At 11 o'clock supper was announced, and, after more singing and dancing, all retired at 1 a.m. But not to rest, for the tragedian, the chamberlain and the purser, who, with the captain, were embunked in a bed, 17 feet long by 9 feet wide, were aroused by the nasal sounds of the last mentioned gentleman. When convinced that he could no longer requiescut in pacs, he said "if he couldn't sleep, he didn't see why the others should," so he called for coffee. Coffee not being forthcoming at 2:30 a.m. the gallant captain might have been seen meandering through the cane fields until 5 a.m. when he even roused His Majesty, who passed the interval before the morning meal by playing

croquet. His Majesty was escorted to the Steamer Waimanalo by the whole party, the musicians and the singers, on the attentive host's railway, re-echoing cheers being given to "the most genial King and accomplished gentleman," a "tiger" being added for Hon. John Cummins.



### MONEY ORDER BUSINESS, U. S. A.

The total number of money-order offices on June 30th, was 5,927. The number of money-orders issued during the year was 8,807,556, of the value of \$117,329,406. The number of orders paid was 8,602,625, and the value of those paid and repaid was \$117,344,281. The total amount of fees received was \$1,101,-821. The ratio of improper payments to the total number of orders paid was as 1 is to 273, 471.

The gross domestic revenue of the bureau was \$911,704, the foreign revenue was \$99,915, on a total of \$1,011,619. The net revenue, after deducting expenses paid from appropriations, was \$159,104.

The total number of international money-orders issued was 446,326, of an aggregate value of \$7,717,832 .-The total number of money-orders of all kinds issued was 9,273,882, of an aggregate value of \$125,047,238; the total amount of fees received was \$1,272,060.

Postal notes have been extensively employed by the public since they were introduced, and comprised from twenty-five to thirty of the transactions.

The United States exchanges mon-ey-orders with the following countries: Canada, Great Britain, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, France, Jamaica, New Zaland, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania, British Ludia and Postugal Gueluding the India and Portugal (including the Azores and Madeira Islands. ) - Ogle County Reporter.

### A HINT FOR THE CLERCY.
