

COUNCIL APPROVES \$10,000 PLAN

The Ebeye Municipal Council has approved the Shelter Improvement and Recreation Plan drawn up and proposed by popular young Youth Corps Director, Ray Stanford, PCV.

The \$10,000 plan provides for a complete recreation program (described in last issue of the EBEYE VOICE), in addition to physical improvement of available space in the community shelter.

Included in the shelter aspect of the plan are provisions for a party area, ping pong tables (4), a pool table, food and soft drink vending machines where residents may sit and talk while relaxing, a library and reading room, a large area for holding public meetings or large parties, plus other improvements and added attractions too numerous to mention.

The present EBEYE VOICE office is to be the first casualty of the newly approved multi-thousand dollar operation. Our new office will be located on the opposite side of the shelter. The present Municipal building will be deserted by the Council as well. The members will take up business in the shelter in an area prescribed by the plan.

U.S. COLONIALISM IN MICRONESIA

The EBEYE VOICE has received a story from the Guam Daily News concerning the congressional hearings in Washington over Micronesia's political status (see related story from MNS on page 10). A Guam Daily News correspondent acquired some of the committee's secret transcripts and we enclose excerpts from the Guam Daily News, Friday, November 1, 1968:

From my examination of the transcript I came to the conclusion that the root of the trouble was insistence by the State Department that the people of Micronesia must be given their choice of independence or associating themselves with the United States.

The Interior Department which administers the trust territory would go no further than allowing the Micronesians to vote for a form of territorial status of the unincorporated variety which is now accorded Guam.

Here is what a high official of the State Department told the sub-committee when asked for the U.S. objective in Micronesia: "We are anxious that they be given an opportunity to express themselves at the earliest feasible date, primarily because we think the national interest of the U.S. would be best served by these people giving what we consider to be the right answer to any plebescite, and the right answer, in our judgement, is continuing association with the United States."

A defense official, commenting on the possibility of using the Trust Territory as a "fall back" area for defense installations, if the U.S. relinquishes its bases in Japan, Okinawa, or Southeast Asia, said, "there have been some preliminary studies made by the Army as to the possibility of stationing land forces there."

At this stage of the hearings, a member of Congress told the defense official "There isn't going to be any plebescite until we take care of these things that are being done by American installations."

He was referring to Kwajalein, a test site for the Army Sentinel anti-missle system command. About 500 (700 to be exact: editor) Micronesians work there and most (all: editor) of them live on the nearby island of Ebeye. It was reported that on Ebeye the housing situation is still acute and there are

1,000 persons living in broken shacks which are pieced together with odd bits and pieces of lumber saved from packing crates and old rusted iron roofing sheets. Most are without windows and toilet facilities. Some are so crowded that people are forced to sleep in shifts. On Kwajalein members of the sub-committee were told also that Micronesians cannot ride taxies or wash their clothes at the laundromat.

One member of the sub-committee described the attitude of military personnel he encountered in the Trust Territory as "about the worst example of antique colonialism I have ever found in my life."

As to the overall situation in Micronesia, one member said, "We now apparently have lost a generation as far as the Trust Territory is concerned." "Twenty years of mismanagement and bungling," said another, "that is our record in Micronesia."

ARE WE READY FOR INDEPENDENCE?

One of the most fantastic features of any advanced society in Micronesia in present time is the choice of Independence or association with another country. That is going to be an interesting and fantastic story throughout all of Micronesia.

To me, independence or association with another country involves many concepts and a complicated, advanced society. I am thinking in the first place of the six districts in which I am interested: Marshalls, Ponape, Truk, Palau, Yap, and Mariannas. For this moment I will say that all societies in Micronesia, whatever there political structure or legislative formulations, are going to be faced with this same choice of independence so long as we have association with the United States, and that the results are not only going to be significant, but much too significant.

I know that we can take care of our own political responsibility and still be able to associate with the other country, but most of us feel that everything can be taken care of in our future status. But if we do, we shall not even begin to understand what is really happening. We shall fool ourselves as we often, with many specific reasons, such as lack of industries, difficulty of the languages of Micronesia, and the long distances between our districts. To me, the only thing we have taken for granted is the status of our government and the political future of our islands.

In conclusion, the point is, that anyone who is drunk with coconut juice is a menace. Any choice he makes--particularly if it involves comparison of other countries--is much more likely to be wrong then right. The higher he climbs, the more he is going to mislead his own country.

WASHINGTON DEBATES OVER FUTURE OF MICRONESIA

A debate in the Congress of the United States over the status of Micronesia has revealed some interesting viewpoints from several congressmen.

The exchange of views, generated in a committee hearing on trust territory's budget for fiscal years 1970 and 1971, centered on mainly two areas.

First, most representatives are in agreement that Micronesia has great strategic value to the United States. Congressman Hugh Carey stated that the area is a "matter of vital strategic concern" to the U.S. Another representative, James Fulton of Pennsylvania, voiced his views: "I favor strongly a new state in the United States in the future composed of the oceanic islands of the Pacific and their peoples." Also congressman Jonathan Bingham registered his opinion that the Trust Territory will remain in association with the US, but he added, that Micronesians "have the right at some stage to make that decision for themselves."

The other area of concern which surfaced in the debates was that of the Trust Territory's administration and the United States' responsibility to Micronesia. Carey said, "our efforts to bring these islands from the chaos and destruction of WW II to social and economic prosperity have fallen short..."

Congressman Rogers Morton of Maryland expressed the committee's dissatisfaction with "the way in which the Trust Territory has been administered," and he also charged the TT of lacking coordination within the leadership and executive agencies involved, but concluded by stating his "comfortable sense of confidence in the personality of the High Commissioner, Mr. Norwood...He is doing an excellent job."
