perhaps allow a few words from

one who lived in the East during the

eventful period when monarchy

was done away with in this coun-

try, and who did what he could in

getting the unclouded facts before

the people who then were sitting in

judgment upon the righteousness

of the cause in question. I counted

it a great pleasure to discuss the

subject freely, (and being asked

upon many occasions) to write and

lecture upon the subject of such

general interest at that time. There

was manifest everywhere at the

very first, a feeling of sympathy for

the Queen, whose crown had been

taken away, but the revolution of

feeling was surprisingly great when

it was found that a lottery and

opium license was being forced up

on the people. This was a direct

and long continued was the applau-

se which was heard from tongue and

pen all over the country. For the

people who were high minded

and patriotic enough to rise and

stop the licensing of two traffic

agents are cursing the world today.

I am not talking fiction now but

facts which I was fortunate so

placed as to know about. Where

is the principle which made these

things wrong at that time? Has

the principle changed simply be-

cause men flagrantly disobey the

law and because opium is brought

into the country contraband? Shall

the traffic be stamped with legal-

ity in order to fill the Government

coffers? If so, then the very people

who so earnestly supported the new

Government and who are working

so persistently for us today, will

experience another revolution of

feeling which will give our cause a

set back, the gravity of which we

cannot now realize. If there was a

principle connected with the opium

question before, there is now, be-

cause principles are not altered

with a change of Government or

with a change in monetary condi-

tions.
