## THE MISSING BOAT.

From the steam whaler North Star, was heard from last Saturday. Marshal Parke received full particulars from Mr. R. W. Meyer, Molokai, and kindly allowed us to copy the letter. The letter is dated March

"I hasten to inform you, that a boat's crew of six American sailors, belonging to the steam whaleship North Star, have been cast ashore on this island, at Kaluakai, an uninhabited district.

a After several days wandering about, three of these men have found their way to my house, after considerable suffering from thirst and hunger, leaving the other three men behind on account of exhaustion.

"The crew consists of the third mate, the boat-steerer, and four men, the boat-steerer being one of the three who found their way up to my place; after refreshing himself a little, left again very soon, with food, water and horses, to bring his comrades up, but unfortunately these three men did not remain in the same place where they had agreed to do, and after searching all day yesterday were not found. The boat-steerer, with the natives, food and horses, returned last night at about 10 o'clock.

" He left again this morning with three of my sons and some natives, water, food, etc., and I sincerely hope that their whereabouts may be discovered to-day, and their sufferings relieved.

"The third mate, who is one of the missing men, is said to be very weak, and the boat-steerer fears that if not found soon, he is likely to perish.

"The men give the following account of the occurrence: Last Monday morning, Feb. 27th, just in sight of Maui and Molokai, the ship discovered a number of whales, in consequence of which five boats were lowered, this crew fastened to a whale, and succeeded in killing the same, but it getting dark, did not succeed to return to the ship, and next morning nothing of the wanted Wanted-Will the present owner vessel could be seen; and not having vessel could be seen; and not having lately sold at an evening sale, and after-sufficient provisions, the third mate wards raffled off at the Astor House, be concluded it was best to make for the nearest land, which they did, but in landing, the boat was shattered to pieces upon the rocks."
