Leading General Managers Arrive and Departures—Notes of the City. The Ke An Ho left this morning for Kailua and Punaluu. Two surf boats, to be used as lighters at Hilo, were brought on the deck of the Australia.

The Hawaiian bark R. P. Bisset made the Bay City in fifteen days having arrived on Nov. 20. The ship Kailua left for King (Chung & Co.)'s new plantation at Pearl City for a rice cargo.

The schooner John G. North arrived at San Francisco on Nov. 20, thirteen days from Honolulu, Hawaii. The Nacoma street wharf is being packed with sugar. The Islander sugar was discharged there this morning.

The bark H. H. Haddock has been moved away from the Pacific Mail wharf to make room for the Alamosa due from the Colonies Thursday. The yacht Sparg is tied up here and the bark Anchor has been moved to the wharf.

The bark Archer left San Francisco on Nov. 27 for Honolulu via Oahu and Kailua. Both carry general cargoes. The steamer James Mackay came in this morning from Honolulu via Oahu and Kailua. She carried a general cargo consisting mainly of rice. Twelve deck passengers came over.

Vessels up and loading on the Coast for this port are the bark Albert and Andrew Welch, barkentine S. G. Wilder, and S. N. Castle and the schooner Transit. The barkentine S. N. Castle and S. G. Wilder made good trips to San Francisco, both arriving on Nov. 25 and 26th respectively. They carried full cargoes of coal consigned to different firms at this port.

The ocean greyhound China will be here from Yokohama and Hong Kong on Monday morning, the 16th inst. on her way to San Francisco. As the China is a fast boat she may be expected to drop in Sunday evening.

ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 2.—Another disturbance broke out in Seoul, the capital of Corea, on November 28th. It was stated, on authority, that there were Americans mixed up in the conspiracy. The Japanese deny that they have had anything whatsoever to do with this latest conspiracy in Corea, but they are now inclined to think the retirement of the Japanese troops will be a sign for all the old troubles to recommence as in former times.

AS TO HAWAII. Horseport Put Out By a Familiar New York Paper. NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—The Herald, in its congressional horseport, concludes that the Cuban insurgents are to be recognized. "As to the Hawaiian matter, it is doubtful whether the Senate will pass in the bill which the house may concur to annex the islands. By joint action the Monroe doctrine will be interpreted for the enlightenment of other nations, but there will be a partisan difference of views as to the working and intent of the resolutions."
