Not only would it attract distinguished scientists, but it would open the purses of wealthy individuals and organized agencies for the advancement of science.

In some peculiar respects, Honolulu occupies a unique position for purposes of scientific research. She is situated in an isolated position, two thousand miles from the nearest continent, in a tropical ocean, swarming with every variety of sea life. The aborigines of the Kingdom are more than any other people afflicted with, perhaps, one of the oldest recorded and the most loathsome of diseases. The capital is of easy access from all parts of the world. The climate is such that a mere existence in it is a pleasure. The scenery is unequalled.

With all these incidental advantages, if we could have an institute, with a splendidly equipped laboratory, like that of Dr. Dohrn at Naples, much benefit might come of it. Hawaii is small, but she is not unimportant; and if we wish to be known as a civilized and enlightened folk, we should give every facility to, and make every effort for, the utilization of such gifts or donations as the outside world sees fit to contribute.

A NOBLE VESSEL.

The Latest Production of the Hall Brothers. The new bark Albert, 648 tons register, was docked at the Fort street wharf yesterday. Captain J. C. M. Winding, her skipper, was busy all day showing visitors interested in marine architecture all over his craft. The cabin is spacious and airy, and is elegantly finished in birdseye maple, mahogany and other hard woods. The designs are plain but arranged with artistic taste. Captain Winding's stateroom is neatly furnished. Adjoining it is the sitting room. The dining room has accommodations for eight passengers. There are four double-berth staterooms supplied with modern conveniences.

The chief officer's room is also nicely furnished. The galley is a model of neatness. The galley in the forward part of the ship contains the donkey engine, kitchen and berths for steerage passengers, and in front of it is the forecastle. The main deck is very wide, so wide that it can be suitably used at any time for dancing and other amusements.

The hull of the vessel is strongly built and skippers and marine experts think she is the strongest vessel built for the Hawaiian sugar and lumber trade. The masts are lofty, giving them a majestic appearance. It is understood that the Hall Brothers of Port Blakely, who built her, claim her the finest and most thoroughly finished vessel that ever left their docks, and those who have seen this superb vessel will agree with that opinion. As to the model, there is a difference of opinion, some saying that the Forest Queen is a better model.

The Albert is owned by Messrs. H. Hackfeld & Co., who have expended about \$53,000 in her construction. Her carrying capacity is 750,000 feet of lumber. Her sailing capacities are superior. Captain Winding stated that he passed all the vessels he had met. All are glad to welcome this new and handsome addition to the fleet of Hawaiian traders.

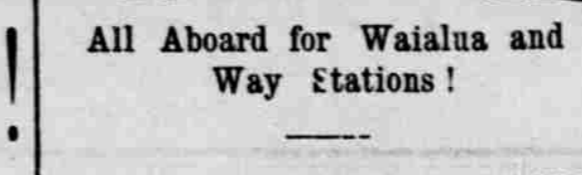
