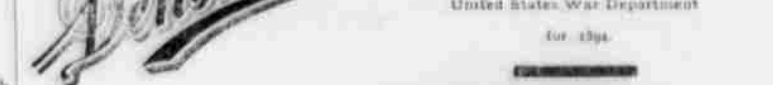

A LITIGANT EXPRESSES HIS REGRET AS TO THE OUTCOME.
