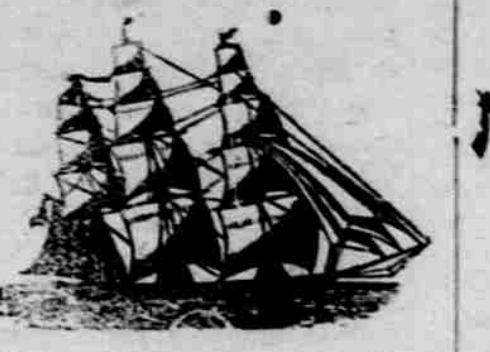

 Lieutenant Knepper has been in Honolulu before, and jolly Hannum warmed the hearts of his many friends by his appearance. The vessel will probably sail on Thursday for the scene of the Oriental war. That is, if a "revolution" does not take place which will necessitate the brave warriors to attend to a few dinners and balls.

The cruiser is described as follows:
 The Yorktown is an unprotected steel cruiser of the third rate; her length in mean load water line is 230 feet. Her extreme breadth is 36 feet. Her indicated horse power is 3200, giving her a sea speed of about sixteen knots an hour. Her displacement is 1703 tons including a bunker capacity of 400 tons of coal. This last fact is considered extraordinary for a vessel of her size. She has a three mast schooner rig and is propelled by twin screws. Her main battery consists of six guns known as six-pounders, besides the same number of smaller guns, and in addition she carries two Gatlings.
