BEWARE.

The present mail brings notice of a wonderful cure for tuberculosis. This must be taken with a very large grain of salt.

In the presence of many noted physicians at the Metropolitan Hospital, on Blackwell's Island, Dr. Wilfred G. Fraulick tonight announced the discovery of a germicide fluid that would cure tuberculosis and other diseases in the early stages.

It must be taken into consideration that in July of this year there was a meeting or congress of physicians from all parts of the world, who discussed this question of tuberculosis.

Seeing how earnestly this question of tuberculosis is studied and followed up by the best medical minds of the day, it is a pity to see any empirical effort being exploited.

FORESTS.

The American Forestry Association met in Denver in the last days of August. The arguments used in the papers are very similar to the arguments used here when bringing this subject so often before the people.

In a paper upon "Irrigation and the Forests," read by George H. Maxwell of Chicago he pictured the results of deforestation in the old world, saying "famine stalks through India because of deforestation; floods devastate China for the same reason.

There is now no doubt that India, which suffers so severely with drought, was once covered with a dense forest growth, and the hand of man, during countless ages has absolutely destroyed every vestige of that mighty forest.

It is with such argument and such analogy that the American Forestry Association must work. With us on the Islands, more speedy lessons can be shown. We have only to consider the condition of St. Helena as it was a couple of centuries ago and as it is today.

As far as we ourselves can see, we have the lesson of the Hilo district of Hawaii ever before our eyes. Such a rainy district as it used to be, the want of water in Hilo unknown.

The thinking men of the mainland are awake to the dangers of deforestation. It is the work of time to make local legislatures and finally congress take steps in the direction of forest protection upon any thing like a grand scale.

COMMERCIAL COMBINATIONS.

That industrial and commercial combinations are not confined to any particular country, though their development has been earlier and more complete in the United States than anywhere else is pointed out by a commercial paper.

Judged from the general conclusions arrived at in the report it seems that in Europe the disposition is to regard combinations as phenomena incidental to the present stage of economic development.

Railway discriminations seem to have had no effect in creating combinations, for they have been practically abolished in Europe. There appears to be no inclination toward the passage of laws aiming to destroy the combination—a policy regarded as unwise and impossible—but laws aiming at regulation, and that mainly through publicity, seem to be favored.

In view of the heated attacks made upon commercial combinations on this side of the Atlantic there is a good deal of common sense in the European view. It is like every good thing which we have in this world commercial combination may be used for good, or it may be misused.

The oil experiment upon the roads will be watched with much interest. Mr. Campbell evidently intends to give the matter a thorough trial and is taking the utmost care that the trial should be fair.

Grand Jury men have plenty of work just now. In time Grand Jury work will not be so exacting. The Grand Jury is something new to a few here, but it is one of the most valuable pieces of machinery both in English and American law.
